A STATEMENT OF OUR PRACTICE OF CLOSE COMMUNION

The Lord's Supper is celebrated at this congregation in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, Our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very Body and Blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins. 1 Corinthians 10:14ff. Our Lord invites to His table those who repent of all their sins and who trust His words, that they may show forth His death until He comes. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's Body and Blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Corinthians 11:29) and because Holy Communion is a confession of faith which is confessed at this altar, (1 Corinthians 10:15-18) any who are not yet instructed in this faith, who are in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church Missouri-Synod, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with one of the Pastors in his office prior to the service. Visitors who have previously spoken with one of the Pastors, and who received permission to commune, do not need to seek permission for subsequent visits to the altar.

FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT: Christ Jesus Defeats Our Temptation and Saves Us by His Faithfulness In faith and the fear of God, Abraham prepared to sacrifice his beloved son, Isaac. At the Word of the Lord, he "took the wood of the burnt offering and laid it on Isaac his son." And "when they came to the place of which God had told him," Abraham bound Isaac "and laid him on the altar" (Genesis 22:6, 9). Then God stayed Abraham's hand and provided "for himself the lamb for a burnt offering" (Genesis 22:8). That Lamb is God's own beloved Son, Jesus, in whom "all the nations of the earth" are blessed (Genesis 22:18). As the Substitute for all the sons of men, Jesus is driven by the Spirit "into the wilderness" to be "tempted by Satan" (Mark 1:12–13) in order to endure and defeat all temptation. We are tempted by our own desire, which conceives and "gives birth to sin" (James 1:14–15). But this blessed Man, Christ Jesus, remained "steadfast under trial," and He has received "the crown of life, which God has promised to those who love him" (James 1:12). His faithfulness, His victory and His life are now given to us by His grace in the Gospel.



Dear members and friends of Mt. Calvary,



Sunday Morning Adult Bible Class: Pastor Sattgast leads the Adult Bible Class this Sunday. We return to our study of St. Paul's Letter to the Romans. Although St. Paul wrote to the Romans nearly 2,000 years ago, the concerns he addressed are just as pressing in our day as they were when he first wrote. As we study the second half of Romans Chapter One, we see that Paul's words speak God's truth to people both of his time and our time as well whose "hearts were darkened" (vs. 21) and who have "exchanged the truth about God for a lie" (v. 25).

Preschool through 6th grade will go to the opening in the sanctuary from SUNDAY SCHOOL 9:15 to 9:30 a.m. then to the basement to their respective classrooms for Sunday school class.

Dear Family Ministry students and parents,

The 8th grade and above class now have the opportunity to take the test on a Wednesday at the normal class time or by appointment when they feel they are adequately prepared. Upon passing the test, they will complete their faith statement and schedule a time for an interview.

The 6th and 7th grade class will be working on memory work. They received a list of 24 Bible passages that every Christian should know. Of those 24, they are to pick 12 verses to recite perfectly to Pastor Kevin. They are to complete all their memory work before classes resume on April 3rd. To keep pace, reciting 2 verses per week is recommended. They may recite these verses on most Wednesday evenings at 6:15, Sunday mornings after each service, or by appointment during the week.

The 6th and 7th graders also received a schedule and assignment description via email for opening and closing prayer during our sessions in April. They are to write out their prayer beforehand and use all 6 types of prayer when they write it. Please contact me if your student is not able to make one of the sessions, so we can rearrange as needed.



The Board of Stewardship would like to make the congregation aware that they can give their offerings electronically if they so choose. First of all we should look at what scripture says. "Everyone should give what they have decided to give in their heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" 2 Corinthians 9:7. We give offerings out of joyful thanksgiving for the gifts that God has given to us. As new tools become available, it is okay if we wish to use them as long as we are careful to remember the reason we are giving. What we have found is, the simplest way for you to give electronically, should you choose to, is through the bill pay services offered by your bank. We realize this is not a fit for everyone, and are not suggesting that people need to adopt this method of giving. We are just letting people know it is a tool available which may be helpful to them. It also could be used to send your offering to church on a week when you are not able to be there. However, we would caution against thinking that the church just wants your money. The Lord looks for hearts set apart for Him alone. —Your Fellow Servants in Christ, the Board of Stewardship

Here are some guidelines:

- 1. Set the church up as biller in your bill pay account.
- 2. Put your offering envelope number as the account number.
- 3. You can designate the fund for the contribution (general, missions, building, preschool) in the memo line.
- 4. Schedule either a one time or recurring transfer.
- 5. Verify that the payment cleared your account.
