## Catechetical Reflection: Confession and the Office of the Keys

- P** The Christian life is one of repentance as we look at our daily responsibilities and wrongdoings. But we do not despair because of the assurance of forgiveness for Jesus' sake that God promises in His Word. Therefore, confession is an essential part of our lives as Christians. What is Confession?
- C** Confession has two parts. First, that we confess our sins, and second, that we receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself, not doubting, but firmly believing that by it our sins are forgiven by God in heaven.
- P** What sins should we confess?
- C** Before God we should plead guilty of all sins, even those we are not aware of, as we do in the Lord's Prayer; but before the pastor we should confess only those sins which we know and feel in our hearts.
- P** Which sins are these that we know and feel?
- C** Consider your place in life according to the Ten Commandments: Are you a father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, or worker? Have you been disobedient, unfaithful, or lazy? Have you been hot-tempered, rude, or quarrelsome? Have you hurt someone by your words or deeds? Have you stolen, been negligent, wasted anything, or done any harm?
- P** If I can confess directly to God and receive forgiveness, what is the benefit of individual or private confession and absolution with my pastor?


- C** First, the pastor has vowed before God in the Rite of Ordination to never divulge the sins that have been confessed to him for God Himself in Christ has removed those sins from the penitent Christian. Second, individual Confession provides the Christian a safe place to name his or her sins so that they no longer carried alone. The absolution is spoken specifically to the person confessing so that there can be no mistaking to whom these words of Jesus are addressed: "I forgive you all your sins."

- P** By His death of the cross, Christ accomplished salvation, providing forgiveness of sins for the entire world. As Christians we confess that Jesus sends His servants to proclaim the good news, forgiving the sins of all who repent and withholding forgiveness from those who insist on remaining in their sin. Following His resurrection, Jesus gave this authority, which we call the Office of the Keys, to the Church (John 20:22-23). Why do we refer to this authority as the power of the keys?
- C** Even as keys lock and unlock, so the authority to forgiven and retain sins opens and closes heaven. Jesus gives two keys to His Church: One key absolves from sin and opens heaven.

The other key retains sins and closes heaven to those who are impenitent. The Church then entrusts the Pastor to serve as steward of the keys.

- P** Who is to be forgiven?
- C** All those who repent and trust in Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of their sins are to be absolved.
- P** Who is not to be forgiven?
- C** Those who do not repent or believe in Jesus Christ are not to be forgiven as long as they continue in their impenitent unbelief.
- P** How is the Office of the Keys related to the proclamation of the Gospel?
- C** The Office of the Keys is a special, God-given way of applying the Gospel to the individual. In addition to generously delivering His abundant grace through Word and Sacraments, God also has given us His Church for our consolation and encouragement in our faith. Jesus promises that “where two or three are gather in My name, there am I among them” (Matthew 18:20).
