
#### **Hymn Introduction**

In the closing stanza of "My Song Is Love Unknown," a special title is given for Jesus, whose ministry and suffering and sacrifice have been described in the preceding stanzas. In the Upper Room on the night in which He was betrayed, Jesus said, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lays down his life for his friends. 


#### **Collect of the Day**

2 Timothy 3:1–9


**P** The Epistle is from Second Timothy, the third chapter.

<sup>1</sup>But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. <sup>2</sup>For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, <sup>3</sup>heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good,

<sup>4</sup>treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, <sup>5</sup>having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people. <sup>6</sup>For among them are those who creep into households and capture weak women, burdened with sins and led astray by various passions, <sup>7</sup>always learning and never able to arrive at a knowledge of the truth. <sup>8</sup>Just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses, so these men also oppose the truth, men corrupted in mind and disqualified regarding the faith. <sup>9</sup>But they will not get very far, for their folly will be plain to all, as was that of those two men.

Matthew 26:1–5


P The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the twenty-sixth chapter.







  For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.





