We represent numerous denominations united in a common statement of faith. Our headquarters is strategically located next to the Henderson County Detention Center, a facility that processes over 5,000 souls per year. At present, we are an all volunteer army of Christian love.

In each institution we face anger, depression, hopelessness, fear, desperation, boredom and wonderful potential.



HURRICANE RELIF WORK

Many members have been wondering how Mt. Pisgah and volunteers have helped our community.

After Hurricane Helene we opened our doors to volunteer workers (both within the congregation and from around the country), through housing, showering, and feeding.

In 2024 we were able to help 209 families or members with removing trees off their home, cutting up trees and debris and helping to make their property safer. In 2025 we have helped 102 families with approximately 40 more people on the waiting list. We are still getting calls for help.

In addition, volunteers have been working with Housing Assistance (Luke) to repair many homes in the community. Several volunteers have been working in Tryon to help clean and rebuild their church.

I hope this help members to understand and realize the work still being done.
