Change the World for Coffee Growers - Change in the offering plate during January helps to offset the purchase of Fair Trade Equal Exchange coffee through the Presbyterian Coffee Project. Using this coffee ensures that more of what we spend on coffee reaches the hardworking, earth-friendly farmers who actually grow it. Your pocket change can help in the offering plate during the month, in the Cups of Compassion in the pews on the last Sunday of the month as they are passed to fill the Bowl of Abundance, and in the "donations" cup each Sunday next to our morning fellowship coffee.
