Scope and Sequence

New Creation's Confirmation Ministry is a 3+ year cycle of class room learning, worship experiences, and retreats. The three years break down as follows:

- YEAR A (2019-20):
 - Bible Background & History
 - Prayer, Lords Prayer
- YEAR B (2017-18):
 - The Creed (pg. 102-173)
 - Confession (pg. 217-230)
 - Sacrament of the Altar (pg. 231-245)
- YEAR C (2018-19):
 - o The Ten Commandments
 - Baptism
- FINAL TERM (Starting Fall 2021)*
 - My Faith Life Today
 - Faith Statement

Completion of these three years, along with the recommendation of the Pastor and the Board of Elders will make a student eligible for the Rite of Confirmation.

Rite of Confirmation Dates:

Current 8th graders – October 31, 2021* Current 7th graders – October 30, 2022 Current 6th graders – October 29, 2023

Instructors for Confirmation in2019-2020 – Pastor Craig McCourt will do the bulk of the teaching again this year – Vicar Jorge Gomez and Intern Sarah Parrish will also be helping and substituting as necessary.

*Beginning with this year and continuing into the future, Confirmation Day will be Reformation day of their 9thgrade year. They will spend the fall of their ninth grade year working on their faith statement and final preparation for Confirmation day.



Confirmation Expectations

Students are expected to be to class on time, with needed materials, and participate in all assignments and curriculum. In each year of confirmation, a student is expected to:

- miss no more than 3 class sessions
- Attend & report on a minimum of 3 Sunday Morning Worship services each month. *Forms are available in the Narthex.*
- Attend and help lead 3 Advent Worship
- Attend and help lead 4 Lenten Worship
- It is also required to attend 2 of 3 confirmation retreats during their confirmation experience.
- Serve a minimum of 20 service hours (See below)

Confirmation Information

Confirmation Texts: The faith that we Lutheran Christians profess is drawn from Scripture. The texts we use to help explore scripture are:

- The Holy Bible (Faith Alive Edition),
- Luther's small Catechism -Shifting to new Illustrated edition in 2020),
- Know The Bible Used in Year A only.







CLASS ASSIGNMENTS: Most weeks there will be some videos, reading, review and/or memory work to be completed before the next class. All homework including memory work, readings etc. can be found at: www.ncshakopee.org/confirmation (see page 7)



SERVICE HOURS: Each student is expected to serve a minimum of 20 Service Hours each year from September – April. This service time can serve anyone in our congregation or community except for members of your family. It can be done through School, Scouts, Confirmation, or Youth Activities.

Acolyting, Projection Screens, Coffee Hour Host, Ushering, Lead Music/singing on Sunday etc. will count as one service hour. <u>(No service hours will be given for participation in the</u> advent or lent midweek services)

Esperanza is Hope Ministry is a great place to find some service hours. Contact Mary Hernandez <u>Mary@ncshakopee.org</u> or Sarah Parrish <u>office@ncshakopee.org</u> to volunteer and watch the bulletin for more opportunities. New Creation will strive to provide a variety of opportunities throughout the year. We will also share outside opportunities to serve in our community. **ACOLYTE:** Confirmation students will serve on a rotating schedule serving as an Acolyte for our Worship Services. Acolytes also assist with Communion and the Gathering of the offering. Students are responsible for finding their replacement and to notify the church office of a replacement. We will send out reminder cards, but you are responsible for being here on your assigned Sunday. Acolytes should arrive <u>no later than 15 minutes before the service</u> and check in with the Pastor to see if there is anything special for that Sunday.

The Office of Acolytes is an ancient leadership role that dates back to some of the very earliest worship in the church. Acolytes provide leadership to the congregation as they serve. <u>Acolytes should dress as</u> worship leaders, for that is what they are – no shorts, t-shirts or sweatshirts when you are <u>an acolyte</u>.



SUNDAY MORNING YOUTH BIBLE CLASS: A Sunday Morning Bible Class for youth grades 6-12 will be held in the Youth Room at 10:30 AM. We strongly encourage participation in this Bible discussion class. (Sometimes youth will be encouraged to attend with the adults depending on the topic)

SUNDAY MORNING ADULT BIBLE CLASS: Parents are encouraged to attend the Sunday Morning Adult Bible Class which meet at 10:30 AM – Your participation in this class sets a great example for your children, as well as helping you develop as a devoted follower of Christ.





RETREAT: This years dates are not yet set, as soon as it is set we will publish it to the online schedule and alert all the families. Students are expected to attend a minimum of 2 of the 3 retreats during their confirmation experience. Parent chaperones are needed for the retreat. We need a minimum of 1 male and 1 female parent chaperones for each retreat. A packing list for the camp will be sent home with permission slips prior to the camp.



CONFIRMATION BANQUET: On the Saturday before Confirmation Sunday the 1^{st} and 2^{nd} -year confirmation families will host a dinner for the students confirming their faith and their families. 1^{st} and 2^{nd} -year students set up, serve the dinner, and clean up after the dinner. (See the Schedule for the Confirmation day meeting – 6^{th} & 7^{th} grade families will plan Banquet)

CONFIRMATION DAY: In the weeks leading up to Confirmation day students will work on their faith statements which will be presented to the congregation on Confirmation Sunday. The night before confirmation will be the Confirmation Banquet. This banquet is for immediate family, Grandparents, and sponsors. Photos of the Confirmation Class will be taken just at 8:30 prior to the 9:00 Confirmation

Service. Confirmands will wear robes for photos as well as the confirmation service. Under the robes gentlemen are to wear dress pants, shirt and tie, ladies are to wear a dress.

ADVENT WORSHIP: See schedule for the dates of this year's Advent Worship. There is no formal class held on those nights, but **there are online videos to watch and reports to file online.** The confirmation students will help to lead the worship on those nights, and their **participation in the service is required** as part of the confirmation experience. Students and their families are encouraged to attend the pre-worship Potluck dinner.





Lenten Worship: See Confirmation schedule for dates of the Lenten midweek and Holy Week services. There is no formal class during Lent, but confirmation students will help to lead the worship on those nights, and their participation in the service is required as part of the confirmation

experience between Ash Wednesday and Easter. Families and students are encouraged to join us for the pre-worship potluck dinners.
