Worship Notes

- Families with children are warmly welcome! We love to have children participate in worship and offer special bulletins just for kids.
- If you need to step out of the worship service with a child, there are chairs set up in the Family Room at the south end of the narthex/entry with speakers from the sanctuary. However, please do not feel pressure to leave if your child acts up a little bit. We want children to learn how to worship with us!
- If you have difficulty standing during the service, please remain seated.
- We have hearing assistance devices for the Sanctuary. If you are having difficulty hearing during worship, let Pastor or one of the AV volunteers know and they will get you a device.
- Restrooms (with changing tables) are located at the north end of the narthex/entry.
- Please remember to silence your cell phone before worship begins.
- If you are a guest today, we are happy you are here! Please take time after the service to introduce yourself to the pastor. We would like to get to know you better!
- If you are a guest, please do not feel obliged to give an offering. If you belong to another
 congregation, please continue to support them. If you are new to Christianity, let us help you
 understand God's gifts to you so that you know why we give offerings. Instead of passing the
 offering plate, we will worship God by placing our offerings in the "noisy can" in the
 narthex/entry.
- Special Note About Face Masks and Distancing: Wearing face masks and social distancing is optional. We understand everyone is in a different health situation, has a different comfort level, etc. Regardless of your situation, everyone is welcome to worship with us without any pressure to shake hands or be in physical contact with anyone. Since wearing a mask for long periods of time can be uncomfortable, you are welcome to step outside for a mask break at any time, even during worship.

Holy Communion

This morning we will celebrate Holy Communion during worship. This is a very special and important part of our life together as Christians. Jesus promises to give us His own body and blood together with the bread and wine in this meal in a miraculous way. Through this meal He forgives our sins and strengthens our relationship with Him and with one another. God invites all who trust in Christ's Word, repent of all sins, and resolve to forgive others as we have been forgiven.

Because participation in this meal is also a confession of the faith of this congregation (1 Cor. 11:26), and because those who eat and drink Christ's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm (1 Cor. 11:27), it is important that all baptized Christians examine themselves *before* communing (1 Cor. 11:28). If you have not been instructed, are in doubt, or do not share the confession of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we suggest that you refrain from communing this morning. We invite you to speak with the pastor after the service, however, so that we might celebrate this meal together in the future.

(Gluten-free wafers are available for those who need them. If this would be helpful to you, please inform an usher or the pastor before we celebrate the Lord's Supper.)

Each Sunday of the year is marked in the church in relation to Jesus' life and ministry. Palm Sunday took place five days before Jesus' death on a cross. On this day He rode into Jerusalem like a king. The people laid down palm branches to honor Him and praised Him by shouting "Hosanna." which means "Save us!"

To "invoke" is to call upon. We call on our Triune God because we are baptized into His name.

+ Preparation +

+ Palm Sunday Procession +

This morning we remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem by beginning worship with a "Palm Sunday Procession." Please take a palm branch as you enter the sanctuary.

During the processional song we will cover the chancel area with the palms.

During the processional song we come forward to place our palm branches at the foot of the cross, symbolizing the honor and respect that is due to Christ, our King.

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Confession of Sins

P: As Jesus enters Jerusalem and this Holy Week begins, our hearts are turned to the Lord in repentant confession, for it is our sin that draws Him to the cross and causes Him to sacrifice His life.

(A moment of silence to consider our sinfulness and need for mercy)

As a called and ordained servant of the Word, in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Confirmation Students Preparing for Their First Communion

Pastor: Today, some of our youth are eligible to receive Communion for the first time. They include Drake Dereschuk and Jack Steensland. These young Christians have been learning about this special gift. They have examined themselves and recognize their need for forgiveness. They trust in Jesus to forgive them completely. They recognize Jesus' body and blood in this bread and wine. They are united with us in faith and life. It is our joy and privilege to welcome them to this altar and receive with them God's promises of forgiveness and life. I invite each of you to please come forward.

(Standing with them today are their fellow youth who are participating with them in the Crossfire/Confirmation program of New Life Church.)

Elder: As the Elders of this congregation, we welcome you to the Lord's Table. We want you to know that you belong here with us. We are fellow sinners, each in need of Jesus and His forgiveness. We invite you, and strongly encourage you, to gather with us often in this meal. As a token of this important step in your Christian growth, receive these gifts.

(each student receives a unique wall cross)

Elder: Hang this cross on the wall in your bedroom. When you see it, remember that God loves you so much that He sent His Son to give His life for yours. Look at this cross each day, knowing you have been united with Jesus in your baptism, and rejoice!

(each student receives a devotion book)

Elder: This is a copy of Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation. Hundreds of years ago, Martin Luther wrote his Small Catechism to be a resource at home to learn more about God and His plan for your life. Contained in this book are his words and so many other helpful resources for you. They address struggles and situations you face each day. Most importantly, this leads you to Jesus. Keep this book handy and read it often!

(The youth may return to their seats)

When combined with the Word and promise of God, the bread and wine are the true body and blood of Christ.
Two things happen in the Lord's Supper: God forgives & strengthens us, & we confess our faith as one.

Words of Institution
