Worship Notes

- Families with children are warmly welcome! We love to have children participate in worship and offer special bulletins just for kids.
- If you need to step out of the worship service with a child, there are chairs set up in the Family Room at the south end of the narthex/entry with speakers from the sanctuary. However, please do not feel pressure to leave if your child acts up a little bit. We want children to learn how to worship with us!
- If you have difficulty standing during the service, please remain seated.
- We have hearing assistance devices for the Sanctuary. If you are having difficulty hearing during worship, let Pastor or one of the AV volunteers know and they will get you a device.
- Restrooms (with changing tables) are located at the north end of the narthex/entry.
- Please remember to silence your cell phone before worship begins.
- If you are a guest today, we are happy you are here! Please take time after the service to introduce yourself to the pastor. We would like to get to know you better!
- If you are a guest, please do not feel obliged to give an offering. If you belong to another
 congregation, please continue to support them. If you are new to Christianity, let us help you
 understand God's gifts to you so that you know why we give offerings. Instead of passing the
 offering plate, we will worship God by placing our offerings in the "noisy can" in the
 narthex/entry.
- Special Note About Face Masks and Distancing: Wearing face masks and social
 distancing is optional. We understand everyone is in a different health situation, has a
 different comfort level, etc. Regardless of your situation, everyone is welcome to worship with
 us without any pressure to shake hands or be in physical contact with anyone. Since wearing
 a mask for long periods of time can be uncomfortable, you are welcome to step outside for a
 mask break at any time, even during worship.

Each Sunday of the year is marked in the church in relation to Jesus' life and ministry.

To "invoke" is to call upon. We call on our Triune God because we are baptized into His name.


Sharing of the Peace

Confession of Sins

P: Friends in Christ, as we begin this time of worship, we start by confessing our sins. We come to our wonderful God and admit our need for His life-saving forgiveness.

John 14:27

We admit to God and to each other that we have not lived according to God's law. We ask God to forgive us for the sake of Jesus' sacrificial death on the cross.

P: Our help is in the name of the Lord,

C: who made heaven and earth. (Psalm 124:8)

P: I said, I will confess my sins to the Lord,

C: and You forgave the evil of my sin. (Psalm 32:5)

(A time of silence for personal meditation on our sin)

P: O almighty God, merciful Father,

C: I, a poor, miserable sinner, confess to You all my sins with which I have ever offended You and justly deserved Your present and eternal punishment. But I am heartily sorry for them and sincerely repent of them, and I pray You of Your boundless mercy and for the sake of the holy, innocent, bitter sufferings and death of Your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to be gracious and merciful to me, a poor, sinful being.

Forgiveness of Sins


P: Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office, as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God to all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

God completely removes our sin through faith in Christ. These words of forgiveness are from God Himself. (John 20:21-23)

We thank and praise God for granting us forgiveness, life, and salvation in Christ.

First Reading

Acts 3:11-21

¹¹ While the man held on to Peter and John, all the people were astonished and came running to them in the place called Solomon's Colonnade. ¹² When Peter saw this, he said to them: "Fellow Israelites, why does this surprise you? Why do you stare at us as if by our own power or godliness we had made this man walk? ¹³ The God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God of our fathers, has glorified his servant Jesus. You handed him over to be killed, and you disowned him before Pilate, though he had decided to let him go. ¹⁴ You disowned the Holy and Righteous One and asked that a murderer be released to you. ¹⁵ You killed the author of life, but God raised him from the dead. We are witnesses of this. ¹⁶ By faith in the name of Jesus, this man whom you see and know was made strong. It is Jesus' name and the faith that comes through him that has completely healed him, as you can all see.

The "collect" is prayed by Christians throughout the church each week. It "collects" all our prayers together into one general request fitting with the theme of the day.

During Easter it is traditional to read from the books of Acts instead of the Old Testament. The book of Acts is a record of the life and ministry of Christians in the first century.

¹⁷ "Now, fellow Israelites, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did your leaders. ¹⁸ But this is how God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, saying that his Messiah would suffer. ¹⁹ Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord, ²⁰ and that he may send the Messiah, who has been appointed for you—even Jesus. ²¹ Heaven must receive him until the time comes for God to restore everything, as he promised long ago through his holy prophets.

R: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

Second Reading

1 John 3:1-7

¹ See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him. ² Dear friends, now we are children of God, and what we will be has not yet been made known. But we know that when Christ appears, we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is. ³ All who have this hope in him purify themselves, just as he is pure.

⁴ Everyone who sins breaks the law; in fact, sin is lawlessness. ⁵ But you know that he appeared so that he might take away our sins. And in him is no sin. ⁶ No one who lives in him keeps on sinning. No one who continues to sin has either seen him or known him. ⁷ Dear children, do not let anyone lead you astray. The one who does what is right is righteous, just as he is righteous.

R: This is the Word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

Gospel Reading Luke 24:36-49

P: The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the twenty-fourth chapter.

C: Glory be to You, O Lord.

³⁶ While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ³⁷ They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. ³⁸ He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? ³⁹ Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have."

⁴⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and feet. ⁴¹ And while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate it in their presence.

⁴⁴ He said to them, "This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets and the Psalms."

"Epistles" are letters written by Jesus' apostles to the church. They teach about Jesus and instruct us for living as His people. The apostles were led by the Spirit of truth. (John 16:13)

"Gospel" literally means "good news." The four gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) tell the good news of Jesus' life, death, resurrection, and promise to return.

John writes, "These things are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, and by believing you may have life in his name." (John 20:31)

Prichard, 1811–87 Text and tune: Public domain ⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. ⁴⁶ He told them, "This is what is written: The Messiah will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, ⁴⁷ and repentance for the forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹ I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high."

P: This is the Gospel of the Lord!

C: Praise to You, O Christ!

Confession of Faith

P: Christian, what do you believe?

C: I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Jesus instructs us to confess our faith in Him. (Matt. 10:32). Today we confess our faith with the words of the Apostles' Creed, which has been confessed in various forms since the 2nd Century AD.


