We praise God that we were able to raise \$2,089 in our door offering last week (including the matching funds from our Men's Group) to support the food and storm victims in Texas.

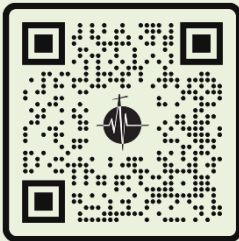
