For RITI, we hosted 20 men during our two nights in December. We had over 40 volunteering opportunities met. The men we have hosted have been very appreciative of the meals, the clothing, the food, and other supplies they have received. We have prayed together, talked about life's challenges, offered words of encouragement, and received God's blessings on both our guests and ourselves.



In particular, we had a guest last Friday who has been separated from the love of his life, his granddaughter, due to the actions of his daughter, and he was so passionate about wanting to be present for his granddaughter and to be in her life, but DCS has moved her out of his range so all he can do is talk to her on the phone occasionally. We talked about his situation and prayed for deliverance for him, his daughter, and his granddaughter.

In another case, we had a guest who was very appreciative of the Christmas stockings and everything else that we provided. He confided in me that due to the included gift card he could make purchases at McDonalds and they would be less likely to force him to leave. He was traveling around with all his meager possessions in one of the last things he was able to retain, a suitcase from his prior life. He is looking for work and now that RITI has given him a mailing address, he is feeling more confident he can get work.

And not to mention, the fellowship of those who help. We have a great team; many people go the extra mile to help. That is truly a God sighting for me — the love of Christ is not invisible, I see it plainly every time we host RITI.




community blood supply and ensure hospital patients have the lifesaving blood they need.






