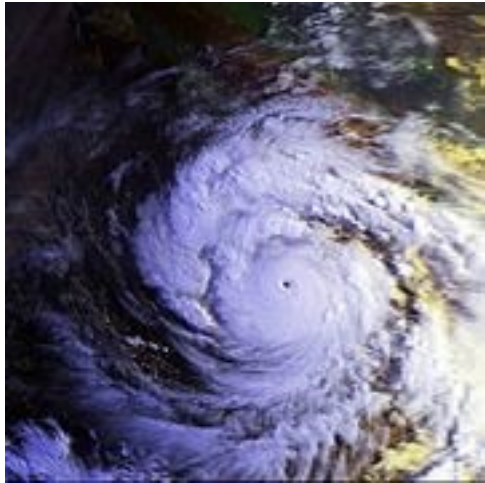

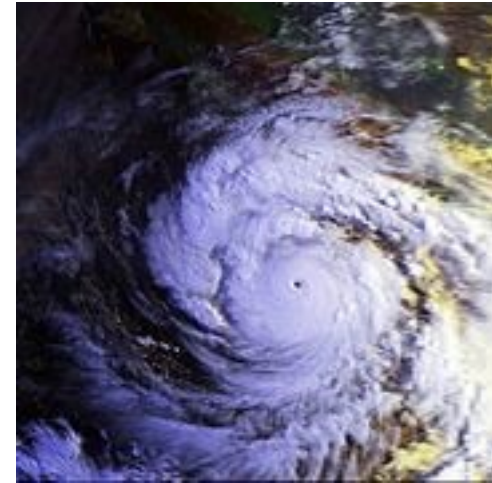

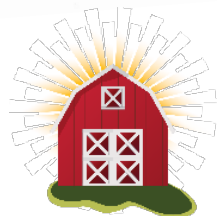

For those of you living east of Granville...

1. Start out heading west on OH-161W
2. Take the OH-16 exit toward Granville/Columbus
3. Turn left onto Columbus Rd. *(for 0.3 miles)*
4. Columbus Road becomes Cherry St. *(for 0.2 miles)*
5. Turn left onto W. Broadway *(New Hope Granville Church is on the corner of Cherry and Broadway) for 1 mile*
6. Turn slight right onto Raccoon Valley Rd/County Hwy-539 *(Raccoon Valley is 0.1 miles past Beechwood Dr.) for 1.2 miles*
7. Turn slight right onto Loudon St/County Hwy-110 *(If you reach Hardscrabble Rd, you've gone about 0.7 miles too far) for 0.3 miles*
8. Loudon Crest Farms – 1616 Loudon St. is on the right

For those of you living west of Granville...

1. Use your GPS or Mapquest and get your own directions 😊

1. Start out heading west on OH-161W
2. Take the OH-16 exit toward Granville/Columbus
3. Turn left onto Columbus Rd. *(for 0.3 miles)*
4. Columbus Road becomes Cherry St. *(for 0.2 miles)*
5. Turn left onto W. Broadway *(New Hope Granville Church is on the corner of Cherry and Broadway) for 1 mile*
6. Turn slight right onto Raccoon Valley Rd/County Hwy-539 *(Raccoon Valley is 0.1 miles past Beechwood Dr.) for 1.2 miles*
7. Turn slight right onto Loudon St/County Hwy-110 *(If you reach Hardscrabble Rd, you've gone about 0.7 miles too far) for 0.3 miles*
8. Loudon Crest Farms – 1616 Loudon St. is on the right

For those of you living west of Granville...

1. Use your GPS or Mapquest and get your own directions 😊
