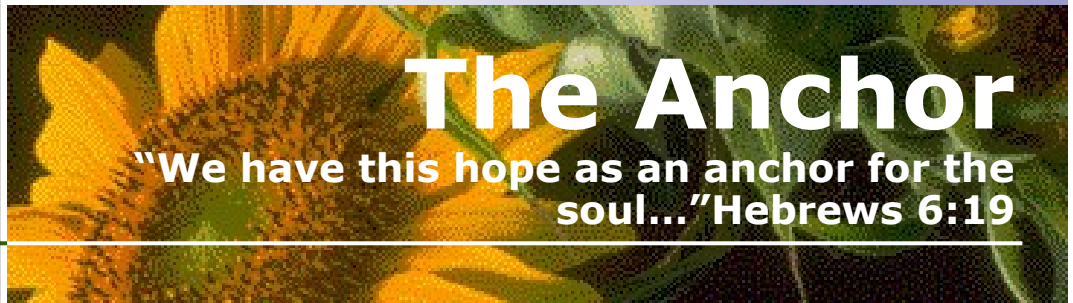

From the Pastor

Why do we have Creeds

Sunday, May 30th is Holy Trinity Sunday, the Sunday of the long creed. You know the creed that goes on and on, and we only say it once a year. The Athanasian Creed is recited by Orthodox Churches across the globe on this day. But it reminds me of the question, "Why do we have creeds at all?" This is a good question. We say a creed at all our services. We recite the Nicene Creed most Sundays because it is the traditional creed for a Communion Sunday. We recite the Apostles Creed for non-communion service. And, of course, recite the Athanasian Creed on Holy Trinity Sunday.

I was talking to a man a few days ago and it got me thinking about creeds. He attends a church that doesn't have any "creeds". He said, "we don't have creeds, we have deeds". (Which itself is a creed) What he was telling me was that we are wrong because creeds aren't found in scripture. While I did agree that you cannot find the Apostles Creed in the Bible, it's not not in the Bible either. So I went through a few lines and asked him if they came from scripture. He agreed that they all came from scripture.

What the creeds do for us is to give us a succinct statement that we can understand and remember. Often when I am on a shut-in call, the people can't remember other parts about the liturgy, but they remember the creed. They also bring our beliefs down a few lines so that we can remember them if someone asks us what we believe. If someone asks, you can simply say, "I believe in God the Father Almighty..." and give your whole faith in about a minute.

Jesus said, **"Therefore whoever confesses Me before men, him I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven."** (Matt 10:32 NKJV) Simply saying the words don't bring you salvation, by the faith that God gives you is expressed in the creeds. When you are confessing them in church, you are confessing your faith in Christ, before men. The creeds remind us who the Father is, who Jesus really is, and who the Holy Spirit is. So the creeds keep us from following after heresies that come up, they keep us in the true faith. So even if my friend doesn't understand, the creeds serve to help us throughout our lives, and we are blessed to have them.

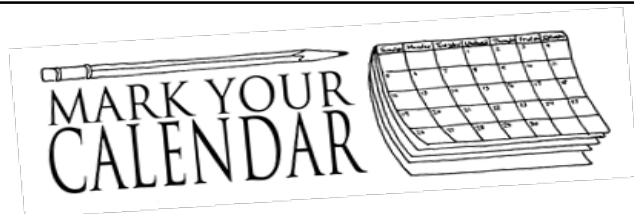

- Nature trail through the wooded area

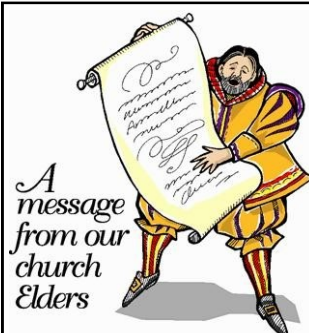

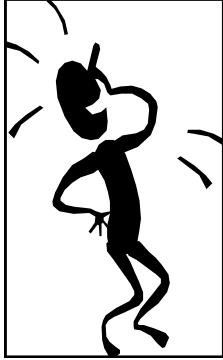

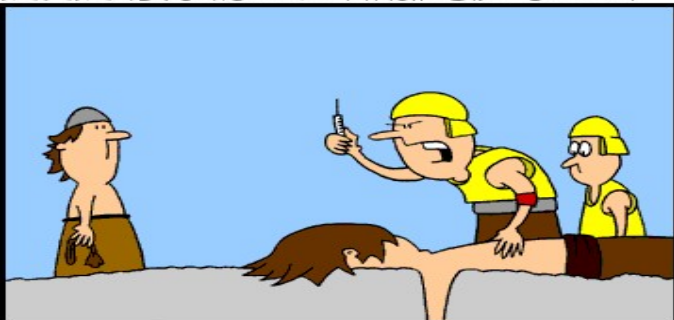
