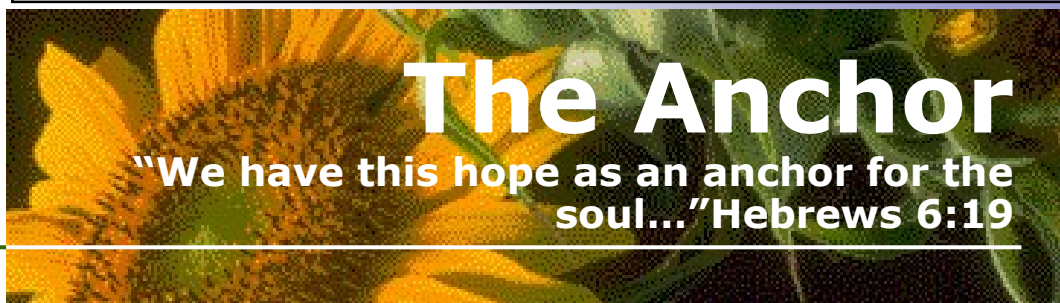

## From the Pastor

Dear Saints of New Hope Lutheran Church,

You all know how I end every service, "Four chapters a day and you're through the Bible in a year, Go out and serve our Lord". You are probably hiring my voice in your head as you read this. There is a reason that I say this, it is not my plan just to give you more work to do every day. I say this because this is one of the Means of Grand our Lord has given to us.

The Lord gives us Baptism, The Lord's Supper, and His Word to bring and strengthen faith. You were baptized into Christ's Church through the water and the Word. Through this sacrament, the Holy Spirit gives faith. (II Peter 3:21) The Spirit strengthens your faith through the Sacraments of the Lord's Supper. Through the Word of God, He tells you what He wants you to know about Him. When you read scripture, you are reading the very Words of the Creator of the universe for you. That is why I repeatedly encourage you to read the Bible so you can read the Word of God yourself.

Having said this, I understand it is not always easy to start and continue reading the Bible. Some languages aren't familiar, and the times aren't that familiar. So how do you start? The best way is to start at the beginning with Genesis 1:1 and read through to Revelation 22:21. But, I have a way for you to get started that might be an easier way to dive into God's Word.

This spring, I assigned the confirmation class to read the Book of John. The Book of John is different than the other gospels. Matthew, Mark, and Luke are written pretty much in the familiar timeline format. John is different. As I have described in sermons, John is like the color commentator while watching a football game. The other three gospels certainly give us the facts about the earthly life of our Savior. John gives a flavor to the events and brings the events alive. Reading the Book of John is great way to introduce yourself to reading scripture.

The assignment I am giving you is that over the month of July, read the Book of John. In addition, I am assigning you the same thing I assigned them.

A) Find a place where Jesus is shown as the Christ:

B) Find a section you like and, in a paragraph, why you like it.

C) Find other sections that have the same theme, words, location, etc. In a sentence write why you think these things are the same. (This will help develop a better understanding of theology)

Through this study, you will see Jesus as the Christ. If you really want to have fun with this turn it in. Send me an email with your answers and we can talk about it. Either way, if you read the Book of John over the next month, you will be blessed, and your faith will be strengthened.

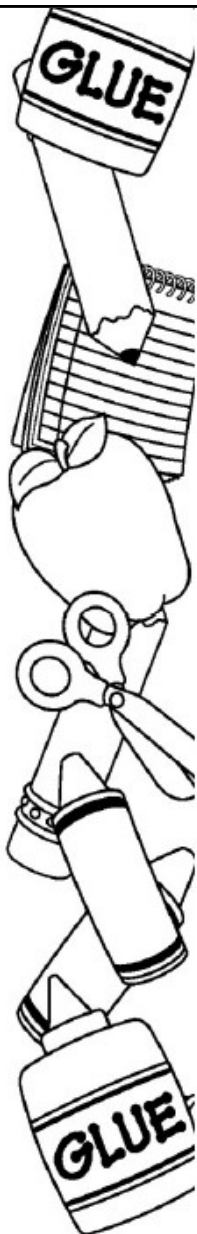

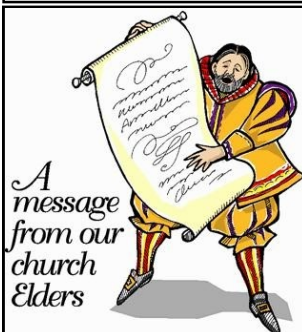
Here are other details...We need LOTS of workers this year to pull this off. We are adding the food and fun back into our Fest this year.

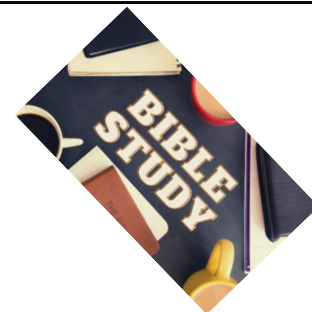

## Stewardship



Each July we celebrate the freedom that we enjoy as Americans. For example, we enjoy the freedom of religion. That is a great blessing but, unfortunately, many people live as though freedom of religion means “freedom from religion.” We know better. Freedom is not so much **“from”** as it is **“for.”** And freedom is a gift that comes at a great cost. We do well to remember as Americans that our freedom was gained originally and is still being defended by those who have put their lives on the line so that we might remain free.

Unfortunately, some Christians seem to live as if the freedom that Christ won for us is a **“freedom from”** rather than a **“freedom for.”** St. Paul spoke so eloquently against this false notion when he penned these words in Galatians 5:13-14: ***You, my brothers were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love. The entire law is summed up in a single command: “Love your neighbor as yourself.”***

## *Stewardship continued*

The truth is that we have been freed from the desire to use all of life, including our gifts of time, talent and treasure, in a purely selfish way. As Christian stewards we recognize that God is the Owner of all things and we are managers. Good managers use that which belongs to the Owner according to His purposes. A Lutheran leader of the past century said it so well: ***“Christian stewardship is everything I do after I say I believe.”***

*May God help us, His freed people, to use all of life and life's resources for His purposes.* This is our proper response to the extravagant love and amazing grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. To do any less is to deny who and Whose we are!

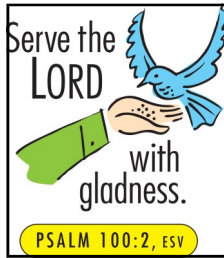

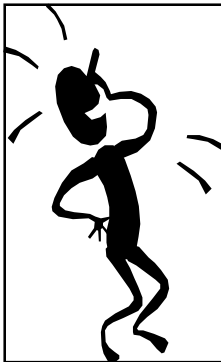
