

### Of the Millennium

With the Augsburg Confession (Art. XVII) we reject every type of millennialism, or Chiliasm, the opinions that Christ will return visibly to this earth a thousand years before the end of the world and establish a dominion of the Church over the world; or that before the end of the world the Church is to enjoy a season of special prosperity; or that before a general resurrection on Judgment Day a number of departed Christians or martyrs are to be raised again to reign in glory in this world; or that before the end of the world a universal conversion of the Jewish nation (of Israel according to the flesh) will take place.

Over against this, Scripture clearly teaches, and we teach accordingly, that the kingdom of Christ on earth will remain under the cross until the end of the world, Act 14:22; John 16:33; 18:36; Luke 9:23; 14:27; 17:20-37; 2 Tim. 4:18; Heb. 12:28; Luke 18:8; that the second visible coming of the Lord will be His final advent, His coming to judge the quick and the dead, Matt. 24:29, 30; 25:31; 2 Tim. 4:1; 2 Thess. 2:8; Heb. 9:26-28; that there will be but one resurrection of the dead, John 5:28; 6:39, 40; that the time of the Last Day is, and will remain, unknown, Matt. 24:42; 25:13; Mark 13:32, 37; Acts 1:7, which would not be the case if the Last Day were to come a thousand years after the beginning of a millennium; and that there will be no general conversion, a conversion en masse, of the Jewish nation, Rom. 11:7; 2 Cor. 3:14; Rom. 11:25; 1 Thess. 2:16.

According to these clear passages of Scripture we reject the whole of Millennialism, since it not only contradicts Scripture, but also engenders a false conception of the kingdom of Christ, turns the hope of Christians upon earthly goals, 1 Cor. 15:19; Col. 3:2, and leads them to look upon the Bible as an obscure book. (A Brief Statement of the Doctrinal Position of the Missouri Synod, 1932)

# Hey Pastor...

Hey pastor, We preach teach and believe that the Lord's Supper is the True Body and Blood of Jesus. Is there a way we should prepare to come to the table?

Yes, we eat to approach the table in repentance, knowing that our salvation is based solely on what Christ did for us on the cross. One of the ways to do that is through this series of questions that can also be found in the hymnal on page, 329. You can review the same list each Sunday morning before receiving the Sacrament.

1. Do you believe that you are a sinner? Yes, I believe it; I am a sinner.

# Hey Pastor... continued

2. How do you know that?

From the Ten Commandments; I have not kept them.

3. Are you also sorry for your sins?

Yes, I am sorry that I have sinned against God.

4. What have you earned from God with your sins?

His wrath and displeasure, temporal death and eternal condemnation.

5. Do you also hope to be saved?

Yes, that is my hope.

6. In whom, then, do you take comfort?

In my dear Lord Christ.

7. Who is Christ?

The Son of God, true God and man.

8. How many Gods are there?

Only one, but there are three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

9. What did Christ do for you so that you take comfort in Him?

He died for me and shed His blood on the cross for the forgiveness of sins.

10. Did the Father also die for you?

No. The Father is God only, as is the Holy Spirit; but the Son is both true God and true Man. He died for me and shed His blood for me.

11. How do you know this?

From the holy Gospel, from the words of the Sacrament, and by His body and blood, given to me as a pledge in the Sacrament.

12. What are these words?

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night in which He was betrayed, took bread, gave thanks and broke it and gave it to His disciples and said: "Take eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me." In the same way also He took the cup after supper, gave thanks and gave it to them, saying: "Take and drink of it, all of you; this cup is the New Testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

- 13. Do you believe, then, that the true body and blood of Christ are in the Sacrament? **Yes, I believe it.**
- 14. What moves you to believe this?

The words of Christ: "Take, eat, this is My body! Drink of it, all of you, this is My blood!"

15. What should we do when we eat His body and drink His blood and in this way receive His pledge?

We should remember and proclaim His death and the shedding of His blood, as He taught us: "This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

16. Why should we remember and proclaim His death?

So that we may learn to believe that no creature could have made satisfaction for our sins—only Christ, true God and Man, could do that; and so that we may learn to be terrified by our sins, and learn to regard them as serious; and that we may find joy and comfort in Christ alone, and thus be saved by this faith.

17. What moved Christ to die and make satisfaction for your sins?

His great love for His Father, for me and for other sinners, as it is written in <u>John 15</u>, <u>Romans 6</u>, <u>Galatians 2</u>.

18. Why, then, do you wish to go to the Sacrament?

That I may learn to believe that Christ, out of great love, died for my sins; and then, that I may also learn from Him to love God and my neighbor.

- 19. What should admonish and encourage a Christian to receive the Sacrament of the Altar often? For God's sake, both the command and the promise of the Lord Christ should drive him to the Sacrament; then also his own need that hangs around his neck, because of which the command, invitation, and promise are given.
- 20. But what should a person do if he can't feel this need, or if he can't find in himself any hunger or thirst for the Sacrament?

To such a person no better advice can be given than this:

First, he should put his hand on his chest to see if he, too, has flesh and blood, and he should believe what the Scriptures say about it in <u>Galatians 5</u> and <u>Romans 6</u>.

Second, he should look around to see if he is also still in the world, and he should consider that there will be no shortage of sins and troubles, as the Scriptures say in <u>John 15-16</u> and in <u>1 John 2</u> and <u>5</u>.

Third, he will, for this very reason, also have the devil near him, who, with his lies and murdering day and night, will grant him no peace, within or without, as the Scriptures picture him in <u>John 8</u> and <u>16</u>, <u>1 Peter 5</u>, <u>Ephesians 6</u>, and <u>2 Timothy 2</u>.
