#### Here to Stay

We hear of surveys and studies that reveal church attendance is down across the country and that the newest generation finds no interest in attending, much less joining a local congregation. A panic might set in that maybe the church is failing. Maybe, just maybe, that this shift in the demographics is a piece of the end times puzzle that is revealing Jesus is closer than ever to His triumphant return. Then we might look closer to home and wonder what we have done wrong that the church has lost its standing in the local community, that the truths that we hold so dear and so valuable, are dismissed as the newest form of prejudice and just another reason the general public doesn't and won't believe in God.

Shortly after Jesus ascended to sit at the right hand of God and the Jewish leaders breathed a sigh of relief that the biggest threat to the kingdom they had built was gone, Peter and the disciples picked up where Jesus left off and were healing, teaching and baptizing in the Name that simply won't go away.

<sup>33</sup>When they heard this, they were enraged and wanted to kill them. <sup>34</sup>But a Pharisee in the council named Gamaliel, a teacher of the law held in honor by all the people, stood up and gave orders to put the men outside for a little while. <sup>35</sup>And he said to them, "Men of Israel, take care what you are about to do with these men. <sup>36</sup>For before these days Theudas rose up, claiming to be somebody, and a number of men, about four hundred, joined him. He was killed, and all who followed him were dispersed and came to nothing. <sup>37</sup>After him Judas the Galilean rose up in the days of the census and drew away some of the people after him. He too perished, and all who followed him were scattered. <sup>38</sup>So in the present case I tell you, keep away from these men and let them alone, for if this plan or this undertaking is of man, it will fail; <sup>39</sup>but if it is of God, you will not be able to overthrow them. You might even be found opposing God!"

Gamaliel was one hundred percent right because if Jesus was from God then His name would remain. His point was that people come and people go. Ideologies and opinions change with the seasons. If the disciples were teaching their own truths, if they were stirring up the people with rhetoric or propaganda, their movement would die with them. However, if what they were doing was being moved by God, no one would be able to stop them. Not the Jewish leaders, not the Romans and surely Satan would be no match for the power of God.

There seems to be so much uncertainty in the world today. So much of the current "wisdom" that is being peddled on the internet and on TV is based on nothing more than popular opinion. While this demonstrates that the true church has fallen out of favor with the new temporal powers that be, it will be eventually revealed for what the temporal powers truly are, temporary.

It will stand against the winds of ignorance and of self-centeredness and the constant crashing waves of sinful rebellion because God's Church is built upon the fulfilled promise of God. Jesus Christ Himself is the cornerstone and nothing of this temporary world will prevail against the kingdom which has no end. #### April Townhall Meeting Recap

On Sunday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> the congregation met to discuss: 1) where we are in the process of changing one of our services and 2) the possibility of an electronic sign replacing our existing sign along Pentz Rd.

1) On Sunday April 2<sup>nd</sup> and April 23<sup>rd</sup>, we used two different service formats. Our early service used the Creative Worship which we have been using for the last year and our late service was led by the Divine Service setting IV. Moving forward the 8:00am service will be using Concordia Publishing House's Creative Worship. We are currently interviewing potential pianists that would lead the music for this service. It was noted in the meeting that we have a wonderful candidate who would fit well in our congregation for this position and are awaiting word on her availability to complete the interview process. In the meantime, Doris will continue to play the hymns with the organ. The 10:30am service will be using the Divine Service settings found in the Lutheran Service Book, but we will continue to print the service in a bulletin. Doris will continue to serve as our organist for this service.

2) The general consensus of those who attended the meeting was that we should explore the option of an electronic sign. Some of the reasons for doing so were: 1) the ease of changing the sign (especially when it is raining or 100 degrees outside. 2) The effectiveness of having multiple messages which would be a tremendous opportunity to advertise specific Bible studies and Sunday service themes. 3) An electronic sign would help convey the message that Our Savior Lutheran is active and attuned to our current culture.

It was noted in the meeting that the sign would cost somewhere between \$25,000 and \$38,000. Because of the recent expenses of a new roof, sceptic tanks and upgrades to our pre-school yard, the council is suggesting that we fundraise a percentage of the money needed and use our reserves for the remaining balance. The council will form a motion for our next voters meeting with options of specific plans and costs to be voted on by the congregation.

Since this is a large undertaking, the support of the congregation is important. The church council welcomes any comments you may have prior to moving forward with this. Our council officers are: Marc Grosso, President; Caroll Gullickson, Vice President; Roger Klaves, Secretary; Anita Towslee, Treasurer; Cyndi Eiler, Financial Secretary; John Hantelman, Board of Elders; Don Zimmer, Board of Trustees and Pastor Brandon.
