

REMEMBERING THE VOICES

At Yad Vashem in Israel is their holocaust national museum, memorial and documentation center. Built on the HaZikaron, the Hill of Memory, this is a place built to insure that the people of Israel never forget the voices that were stilled by the attempted genocide of the Jewish people in World War II. Just reading about it and seeing the pictures makes one pause to try to hear the millions of voices silenced by death.

The closest feeling to this that we have for our own country I believe is the Vietnam War Memorial in Washington D.C. That wall of names of those who died for their country in a war that was not at the time popular does not glorify that war, but also does not let us take for granted the voices silently crying out from that place of honor. That place silences the selfish heart and reminds a person of the sacrifices made by those men and women.

One does not have to visit a man-made memorial to remember the voices of those who have gone before us. For Christians, the remembering of voices is not limited to a place, but is done in time. On one day a year (though we may do it more often), but at least on one day a year, the church remembers the voices of those who have prepared the way for us. For some, they are the voices of the sacrificed, the martyrs who willingly gave their lives so we might live knowing our Lord. For others, there are the voices of family and friends who steadfastly gave witness to us of the love of Christ through long lives of service and belief. Amid all the voices we are called to remember, is always the voice of our Savior reminding us that those voices are not silenced forever, but will one day raise the joyful shout of triumph at the final resurrection and then will never be quiet again.

Remembering the voices for most people is only remembering the past, remembering what was. For Christians, remembering the voices is our hope for the future. We look forward to when those voices and ours will be raised together to praise our Lord in the eternal kingdom to come. Others remember voices that are dead. We remember voices that will live again. This year on All Saints' Day, take time to remember the voices lest we be unprepared for when they sing again.

Devotion: Opened meeting with prayer

Meeting was called to order by Joe Spahr at 6:31 pm

CHRISTIAN SERVICE:

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made by Joe Spahr and seconded by Steve Wackerly to approve minutes from August 12th as amended. Motion passed.

Facilities Report: Facilities report was given by Al Reml. He is planning on doing small repairs to the pastor’s office and having it repainted. Al also scheduled to have the fellowship hall floor stripped and waxed before Christmas.

Parsonage: Al Reml recommended that the security alarm system for the parsonage be cancelled because it costs \$60 a month and there is nothing valuable inside the parsonage anyway. The only object of significant value on the property is the lawnmower, which is in the garage and therefore not protected by the alarm.

Parsonage: The Board continues to work towards getting an appraisal for the parsonage. Interim pastor Scott Baker would likely use the parsonage during

his time at Peace if he were to be hired.

Worship Schedule:

Courtney Coghill moved to begin discussing within the congregation changing the worship schedule to Sunday School 9:00-10:00 am and worship 10:15-11:30 am. Steve Wackerly seconded the movement. Motion passed.



Office Manager: Joe Palmer moved to extend the office manager’s hours to 25 hours per week indefinitely. Steve Wackerly seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Facilities Manager: David Enterline expressed his thanks for the Board’s work. He also requested that the Board and the congregation take notice of the amount of church money saved by the facilities manager.

Financial Coordinator: Joe Palmer moved that with deep regret the Executive Board accepts Courtney Coghill’s resignation from the Board. The Board thanks her for her service.

Financial Coordinator: The Board will ask Kevin Clark to serve as interim financial coordinator until a new person volunteers for that position.

FINANCE COMMITTEE NOV NOTES

The Budget committee consisting of Bill Fox, Richard Whitford, Velta Johnston, Mel Strensrud, Steve Umbro and Kevin Clark has been meeting every Tuesday since early August. The committee has reviewed Peace's financial situation in detail in an attempt to present a zero deficit budget for the time period of January to June 2020. The committee formulated a series of cost cutting recommendations. These recommendations along with the fact that we have our interim pastor Scott Baker in place at a contract rate that is below the rate of our previous pastor allows us to achieve this goal. Meeting this goal is also dependent on the congregation meeting its offering goal of \$226,000 for this time period which was determined last May after reviewing the pledge cards submitted and putting in an estimate for families that didn't submit a pledge card based on past giving history. The details of the budget proposal are being presented at the 4 town hall meetings (Sunday Oct 27th, Wednesday Oct 30th, Sunday Nov 3rd, and Wednesday Nov 6th) prior to the congregational meeting on November 10th.

The committee will continue to meet during the first 6 months of the new year with the goal of keeping the congregation informed and up to date on our financial situation and apprised of possible decisions that will have to be made prior to calling a new pastor.
