



PASTOR BAKER



OWNERSHIP

I sometimes wonder just how much I could get away with as pastor of the congregations I've served. There are times when the "voice" of pastoral authority carries a lot of weight in decision making and also in the life of the congregations. People are always asking me what shall we do here and if it is right to do this there. There are times when such power could go to a person's head and there might be the occasional temptation to decide on what I want and not on what God wants or what is good for the congregation. So what stops me from falling into such temptation? It is the "Priesthood of All Believers" and the power of the Holy Spirit that makes that Reformation phrase a reality.

At a time when all the power of the church rested with its ordained members, Luther saw that the responsibility of the mission of Jesus Christ could not rest with only a portion of the church. The gifts of Christ, such as the Bible and the Sacrament, were not just for the few, but for all God's people. The responsibility of spreading the Good News was for both the laity and the clergy working together. So Luther translated the Bible into German so all the people could understand it. He once more gave the sacraments to all the people of God and he gave back the responsibility, the priesthood of the Gospel, to all believers. No longer would they only be spectators watching others do God's work.

What this means for us today is that no one person, a pastor or anyone else controls the ministry of the church. It is the responsibility of all church members to own that ministry given to them by Christ. Today, none of us are denied our rightful place in God's work as happened in pre-Reformation time, but I wonder about those who have turned over their part of the ministry to others. Maybe we have forgotten why the Reformation was so needed when we freely give up the freedoms and responsibilities that the reformers gained for us. What about you? Is Christ's church your church or are you only a spectator? Is the Reformation alive in you today?

FACILITIES MINISTRY

Here is a brief update on the facility. Mowing season is coming to a close. Great news! We suffered no real problems or equipment failures. Thanks to all who helped with the flower beds. Special thanks to the Whitford family for having our front flower beds cleaned.

As the school year started we shampooed the carpets in pre-school to try to help in the making the area as safe as can be. We also started fogging each space used by kiddos with a botanical solution to keep the bug away. We are using a chemical similar to what Edmond schools use and applying it in the same manner. All things considered the pre-School has done a great job getting the school up and running.

You may have noticed we are moving ahead with remodeling our main rest rooms near the Parish Hall. Look for some new bright colors with new flooring. This was needed to assess ongoing problems with the old flooring. Also new counter tops will be installed. Thank you to the Phillips family for all their work and participation.

You may have noticed some glass tint samples in the foyer area. We are forced to replace glass panels all the time due to fogging which occurs when the seal in between the glass panels fail. The glass panels have been ordered when they are installed we will look at tinting to prevent the glass deterioration. This will also drastically cut down on heat generated by the glass. This would in turn help our air conditioning systems keep up better.

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made by Mike Freeman and seconded by Joe Palmer to accept the July 7, 2020 minutes. Motion passed.

Financials: Mike Freeman gave a report for July 2019-June 2020 Fiscal Year end with a positive of \$73,701.44. A motion was made by Cecelia Ferron and seconded by Susan Bedwell to accept the financial report. Motion passed.

Mike Freeman reported the July report will be available for September Board meeting. The conversion to new software is being made thus requiring verification the import of financials from Shepherd Staff to the new software were made successfully.

COVID-19: Susan Bedwell reported the rolling average is declining. She stressed the use of face masks and following recommended guidelines of social distancing & hand washing.

An electrostatic sprayer has been purchased to sanitize and preschool are and the sanctuary.

MISSION MINISTRY

Meet Our new Partner in Regional Ministry—San Miguel Lutheran Church



The featured Mission Ministry for October is San Miguel Lutheran Church, a vibrant Spanish-speaking NALC congregation in Fort Worth, Texas, where on an average Sunday, 200 to 300 people join together for worship with Pr. Juan Portillo presiding. The ministry offers numerous outreach opportunities in the Fort Worth area, as well as weddings, confirmation, and quinceañeras. Unfortunately, San Miguel has

encountered serious challenges this year.

More than six years ago, San Miguel left their former church body and joined the NALC, of which they have greatly appreciated being a member. Unfortunately, three years after their departure, their former church body filed a lawsuit against San Miguel for repayment of the grants they had gifted the congregation over many years for a total of \$489,000 which they could in no way afford. With the help of legal assistance partially funded by the NALC, a settlement was reached in June of this year that San Miguel would pay back \$80,000 over 10 years at the rate of \$629/month. This meant they could retain their property and their ministry in the area.

In normal times San Miguel is a self-supporting ministry, but this is not normal times. The legal settlement and the pandemic, which has hit their community hard, has put a serious and significant strain on their ministry. Despite serious challenges their ministry and outreach continues and moves forward.

NEEDS. San Miguel is being mentored by two NALC pastors in the north Texas Mission District. The PLC Mission Team is thrilled to partner with San Miguel and these other congregations. **Prayers** are asked for: those suffering with illness and economic hardship, for Pr. Juan and his ministry team, and that they will be able to continue to pay their bills which they have prioritized over the pastor's salary. We are currently supporting San Miguel with \$100 /month. Those moved to support San Miguel directly may write a check to PLC designated for "San Miguel LC."

We will interview every candidate and can share the number of applicants we interview. Once the call committee feels that a candidate meets the requirements you have indicated below, we will submit the name to the executive board who will invite the pastor to visit our church.

Results of the Survey

How well did we do ministry with our previous Pastor?

Answers ranges from very well to not well at all. Several members noted that our ministry together went well in the beginning. But over time, lack of communication caused a disconnect between the pastor and the congregation.

From your perspective, what are the 3 most significant positive events in our congregation's history? (Please provide dates, if possible)

The congregation noted several significant events in the life of Peace. However, overwhelmingly our move to the NALC, beginning our community mission through Cook's Night Out, and the building of Peace Lutheran Church facility were mentioned the most.

With our new shared ministry model where our congregational members and pastor work together to do the ministry of the church, how well are we doing ministry today?

Several members noted that Pastor Baker has helped us refocus on the work of the church. More people are participating in ministry teams. However, many acknowledged that Covid-19 has affected our progress.

Who is God calling us to be as a congregation?

Most members referred to the Great Commission, sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with the world, connecting people to Christ with a focus on HIM. As the hands and feet of Christ, we work well together, be welcoming, caring, and understanding with each other. Some members stated that how we accomplish our calling should be developed with the new pastor.

Do we have a shared vision and mission?

Most of the congregation stated that we have some members who participate and others who do not. This is typical for churches and did not come as a surprise to us.

As a congregation, what relationship should we have with our new pastor?

The consensus of responses felt we should be friendly and have open communication. The relationship should be a partnership in ministry with mutual love and respect, supportive of each other and available for each other. Many would like the pastor to have an “open door” policy for all members so no one feels excluded.

How do we handle conflict/tension in our congregation? Which of the following best describes our congregation?

Many members stated that we need to let go of past hurts and conflicts and look forward to the new beginning God has planned for us. If you are experiencing the pain of past hurts or conflicts, we encourage you to make an appointment with Pastor Baker to discuss the issue. We want to be united in mind and spirit within the body of Christ as we begin our relationship with a new pastor.

How might our congregation prepare for the coming of our next pastor to create a healthy, cooperative spirit between pastor and our congregation?

PRAYER, PRAYER, PRAYER. Overwhelmingly, our members feel we need to be in prayer for our church and the pastor God is calling for us. We need to continue to communicate with each other, sharing our progress through this call process.

The Congregational Profile to be completed by the Call Committee asks for the top five ministry needs with regard to your next pastor.

The top 5 ministry needs are that the new pastor must be:

- 1. A “people person” willing to reach out to people.**
- 2. Open with congregation.**
- 3. A strong biblical preacher.**
- 4. A pastor in the Word and lives out their faith.**
- 5. Able to encourage and inspire the congregation to serve.**
