Celcco in preparation of Bishop Ngoma consecration



The Celcco district of Tshela had a big gathering in preparation of the consecration of the new Bishop the Rev. Albert Ngoma. Members from Maduda, Nganda Tsundi and Mbata Konde were together to reflect on the big event that will take place in Boma on September 12, 2021. The gathering took 3 days and I was invited to lead a theological reflection about what means the role of bishop and specifically in Lutheran Tradition. The content was well received by clergies and church members who participate on it. We do have 5 more districts to gather for the same purpose, please hold us in your prayers that the Lord may guide us and the church may be prepared for the September event.

God's miracle among orphans



It been over four years since we took the decision of helping orphans especially those who knocked continually in our home doors. We find that many of them where totally in needs and didn't know where to turn. We decided to gather them for prayer and Bible Study also we provided foods, clothes and other assistances and also we paid school fees for some of them, occasionally we still taking care of more than 20 of orphans. We never imagine ourselves to take a big responsibility as seen in the left picture. The child name is Meshack orphan of father but the mother at the back picture near to Serafina still alive and live with the income of \$2 a day after selling crops from the farm. Meshack suffered a lot with appendicitis and hernia that required surgery in the amount of \$350. The child was in serious situation and close to death because the mother couldn't have all that money for child surgery. When we heard the news we approached a Lutheran medical center in Boma that helped us to intervene with no payment. Now Meshack is recovering and ready to go back to school in 10th grade..



Here is the marriage of Sophia who spent 10 years at the orphanage and was very dedicated on her study. Learning her situation, she was among the recipients who received scholarship from us and finished her high school. Since it was impossible for her to go to university, she find a man who loved her and in the picture above was a traditional ceremony of wedding. Sophia married a young boy who work at the telecommunication and wishing her a good start of her own life and blessings from God. We were invited as guest of honor and we were so proud because it is part of mission work. Please hold Pierre and Sophia in your prayer that God may help them to build a faith



Farming become a dilemma in the West side of Congo. The land is kind of green but the production is less because of change of climate probably and also the lack of fniques and appropriate tools to use. We visited this forest in Tende/Kongo Central where the villagers must travel 50km to find a banana to buy. On their own they don't have enough production that may lead in malnutrition specially for children. Some area are producing little bit but still complaining of the production difference that is occurring lately. Lot of rain and big land but the country is true dysfunctional that the government is not able to help farmers to improve their situation. Pray for them.

The picture under is a display of our classroom with students in it. We are doing an effort to follow the government guideline and to make sure that our students are well trained theologically. The only difficulty we are facing is the shortage of professor because we don't have incentive to give to them. Since this isn't a state funded program, the school fight in its own way of making sure that they function according to what they do have available as fund. The school also receive just little from our mission but that it isn't enough to operate. We pray God to provide of many needs of the Theological school for a continuing training of future servants of the church. 35 students are regular and others who comes once a while because of their economic situation but in overall the students are improving and the school is getting being known in the area of Tshela, praise be to God.
