Apostles' Creed

C: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

For those who suffer from loneliness or depression, that they may find hope and peace in the Word of God and the fellowship of believers, let us pray to the Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**

For those of our own family of faith who are sick or homebound, [*especially* _____,] that God would heal and strengthen them according to His will, let us pray to the Lord: **Lord, have mercy.**

Trusting in Your mercy, we bring our prayers before You. We ask You to hear and answer in the way that You know is best. Glory and honor be Yours alone, O Father, together with Your Son and Your Holy Spirit, now and forever.
