

Albrecht, Archbishop of Mainz 1490 - 1545

Luther said this about Albrecht, "It's all the fault of the man at Mainz, who was tricked by his own cleverness with which he wanted to suppress my doctrine and to save his money which he'd sought through indulgences."

Albrecht (also called Albert of Brandenburg) was born June 28, 1490, the younger son of John Cicero, Elector of Brandenburg. In 1513 he became Archbishop of Magdeburg, but one year later, in 1514, he sought to become the elector and archbishop of Mainz.

Church law forbade the holding of more than one diocese, so Albrecht turned to Pope Leo X for an exception. Albrecht took out a loan from the banking house of Fugger and used it to make a large contribution toward the rebuilding of St. Peter's Basilica.

On March 15, 1517, Pope Leo X declared a special jubilee indulgence that would be sold in Germany at the request of Albrecht, Archbishop of Mainz, to help pay for the reconstruction of St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. Half of the proceeds would go to the Pope, and the other half to Albrecht to repay the Fugger bankers. But Albrecht needed a salesman who could really push the indulgences. He recruited a priest named Johannes Tetzel.
