From Pastor's Desk

Dear Members and Friends,

We begin December with the season of Advent. It is a time of preparation, examination, joy, and wonder. One of the symbols we use to chart our way through this season is the Advent Wreath with its 4 or 5 candles. I thought it might be helpful to explain the wreath and its symbolism for as we prepare for the coming of Christ at Christmas, these candles help us to center on the theme that is emphasized each week during the Advent Season.



The first candle of the Advent wreath is a purple one called the **Prophecy Candle**. It signals a calling to repentance. It represents the light of the prophecy concerning the coming of Christ, a light to penetrate the darkness of spiritual ignorance and give <u>hope</u> to the world.



The second candle, also purple, is called **Bethlehem Candle.** It is symbolic of the preparations that are being made to receive the Christ-Child, and it reminds believers today to prepare to receive Him again, each into his own heart. When Christ comes to dwell among him people he brings peace.



The third candle, a pink one, is the **Shepherd's Candle**. Pink is the color of <u>joy</u> and reminds Christians to share their "<u>joy</u> of salvation" with others, even as the shepherds of the first Christmas <u>joyfully</u> "made known the saying which was told them concerning the Child."



The fourth candle, purple again, is known as the **Angel's Candle.** God's <u>love</u> for mankind proclaimed by the angels that a Savior is born for you. It is a reminder that as the angels announced the first Advent of Christ, so they will herald His return at the end of time, when His rule will be established as an endless kingdom of glory in heaven.

The Christ Candle, which may be included in the center of the Advent wreath, is a white or red candle lit on Christmas Eve. White symbolizes the divinity of Christ, while red symbolizes the work of Christ, which was his suffering, death, and resurrection to redeem all.

May God bless each of your preparations, as you anticipate the Christmas Story of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love to each of your families.

Showing Christ's Mercy

L.E.R.T. - Lutheran Early Response Training

For those interested in participating in the LERT Training, Peace is tentatively scheduling training for the end of April. We will have more information for you as it becomes available.

LERT is Lutheran Early Response Training. This is part of the LCMS Disaster Response program. LERT members are not first responders. They assist in repair and recovery operations. LERT teams can be formed in a congregation or by members of separate congregations. Once certified they become part of the Synod's response. LERT teams have assisted after hurricanes, floods, fires, tornadoes, etc. They may deploy to other areas/states if they are willing. LERT responds as the church, sharing Christ's mercy with all in need, not just Lutherans. We are the church in action.

As a part of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, Peace Lutheran has an opportunity to organize a Disaster Response Training Event to be held here at our church. Together with the LCMS we will address the nature of disasters and explore what our response should be to disasters. We will explore how Christ has shown mercy to us, and how we can show our community that same Christ-like mercy. The goal is to prepare our congregation and individual members to be better prepared when a disaster strikes, and to help them know how to respond within our congregation, and in word and deed, within the greater communities.

The training session consists of a registration fee of \$35 per person to cover cost of lunch, materials and travel (for trainer). Training sessions are generally scheduled from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on a Saturday. There are three main sections: 1) An introduction to the LCMS Disaster Response program, 2) congregation preparedness and 3) Lutheran Early Response Teams. Anyone who is interested is welcome to attend the training session (men or women). Only LCMS members who are 18 years or older, however, receive certification as LCMS volunteers.

If you are interested in attending the training session please let Pastor Griesse or Steve Shotwell know.
