From Pastor's Desk

Dear Members and Friends.

This month people across our nation are thankful. As Luther says in his explanation to the first article, God "richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life." We should never belittle the many things God does for us every day.

However, in order to put things in their proper perspective it is necessary that we also remember what he has already done for us and what he will do for us after we leave this world.

The greatest event in the history of the world took place long before anyone in this congregation was ever born. Yet it took place for our benefit. The greatest of all the events in the world was the world's own redemption.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish, but have eternal life (John 3:16). That love, and that sacrifice which he gave for us is priceless.

God was not obligated to provide a way of salvation for mankind. Yet, He knew that unless he sent a Savior into the world every single one of us would be doomed to eternal damnation. So the Scriptures tell us that in his grace, at the right time, he sent a Savior for us.

Disaster Response Teams

As a part of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, Peace Lutheran has an opportunity to organize a Disaster Response Training Event to be held here at our church. Together with the LCMS we will address the nature of disasters and explore what our response should be to disasters. We will explore how Christ has shown mercy to us, and how we can show our community that same Christ-like mercy. The goal is to prepare our congregation and individual members to be better prepared when a disaster strikes, and to help them know how to respond within our congregation, and in word and deed, within the greater communities.

How could you help in a disaster?

Once trained, if a disaster were to occur in our vicinity the Synod or District office would contact the **LERT** (Lutheran Emergency Response Team) here at Peace and we would activate our disaster response.

The training session consists of a registration fee of \$35 per person to cover cost of lunch, materials and travel (for trainer). Training sessions are generally scheduled from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on a Saturday. There are three main sections: 1) An introduction to the LCMS Disaster Response program, 2) congregation preparedness and 3) Lutheran Early Response Teams. Anyone who is interested is welcome to attend the training session. Only LCMS members who are 18 years or older, however, receive certification as LCMS volunteers.

We would like to get some feedback on whether we should hold a Disaster Response Training Event here at Peace. Is anyone interested in becoming involved in this program? Would you be able to attend a training session? Please let Pastor Griesse or Steve Shotwell know ASAP if you would be interested.
