News from Haiti...

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

As Rev. Paul and I talked this week, we noted the Day of Pentecost that is this Sunday. We then noted the ten unique days for those awaiting the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Jesus had promised to send His "Helper"; however, they did not know when this would take place, and He had already ascended. (Ascension Day this year was May 10th). The faithful continue to be comforted as we live in the promises of God.

God's Work in Motion I mentioned to Rev. Paul that I noticed they have continued to receive some rain. He replied, "Yes! We are very busy in the gardens. There is a lot to do with planting and harvesting." One of the crops they are now harvesting are mangos. My wife has found decent mangos in our local grocery store for the last two weeks. While it is a very healthy and tasty fruit, however, I find it also messy with that huge, hairy pit and thick skin. I have watched several Haitians throw a rock to get a mango off the tree, wipe it off, skin it by pulling with their teeth, and eat it with juices on the hands and around their mouths. This was followed with a splash of water on their face and hands. Very refreshing!

The early church realized that "the Word of the God continued to increase" (Acts 6:7). We are excited with Rev. Paul's proposed plans for a worship center. This worship area will have a high ceiling and other components that allow for air circulation as it will also seat over 300 people. Exciting plans. We look forward to seeing how God will work with these plans to reach more people.

Nord Est Haiti Lutheran Mission (NEHLM) has a board member travelling to be with the ministry in the month of June. Please pray for this trip and as NEHLM pursues having a board member on site at least once a year.

Imagine that you're a child on your way to a Christian summer camp.

You're excited to learn more about Jesus and spend time with your friends.

But as you drive, you're suddenly pulled over by authorities. Instead of a life-changing experience growing in your Christian faith, you're detained by the police—all because you were going to learn about Jesus.

I wish I could say this was just a story. But unfortunately, it's exactly what happened to a group of children, pastors, and other church leaders in India last May in the central Indian state of Madhya Pradesh. All the pastors wanted to do was take the group of children to a Christian summer camp in the neighboring Indian state of Maharashtra.

But police officers surrounded the group of sixty children, along with ten pastors and co-workers, as they were about to board a train. There was no escape. The pastors had no idea why the police were trying to detain them. And the children—most of whom were no older than nine—obeyed the police.

It is common for Christians in some areas of India to experience mob violence and wrongful arrests due to pressure and false accusations of "forcible conversions" by radical Hindutva nationalists.

The adults were arrested on charges of kidnapping, cruelty, and forceful conversion. They were tossed into prison.

What's even more shocking? The children were forced to spend three days in a government run children's home and were refused access to their parents!

The children's families immediately protested the detention. They told authorities that their children had not been kidnapped—they wanted them to go to the camp.

The pastors needed help

I don't know about you. But as a father with 10 children and 21 grandchildren, this story shook me.

Thankfully, your prayers and support allowed us to do something about it. ADF International, the global partner of Alliance Defending Freedom, and our allies jumped right in to help. Lawyers pressed to find out why the pastors and others were detained.

It took weeks to get an answer. And it took three long months for the Christians to be temporarily released.

Their ordeal is still not over—their next hearing is scheduled for the first week of June. If convicted, the pastors and other adults face prison sentences of up to seven years for merely organizing a Christian church camp.

"Nobody should be persecuted because of their faith," says Robin David, the ADF International allied lawyer defending the pastors in court. "In India, many citizens face fierce harassment because they belong to a religious minority."

<u>These oppressed people of faith need your help</u>. And we will not stop fighting for them.

Persecution is common in India

Sadly, incidents like this are shockingly common in India.

According to recent reports, Christians in India were targeted for their faith over 240 times in 2017.

Seven Indian states have adopted anti-conversion laws, which are used to discourage people from changing religions. Not only do these laws violate religious freedom, but they fuel discrimination, incite violence, and serve as a stepping stone for serious human rights violations against religious minorities like Christians.

Everyone who wants to change their religion is listed in a public registry. They become targets of violent extremist mobs who oppose religious conversions.

The anti-conversion laws are designed to close the door to the Gospel and restrict all people from freely exercising their faith. And the tragic treatment of the pastors and children you read about above is a perfect example of the effects of these harmful laws.

Thankfully, our allies in India have actively challenged anti-conversion laws in court. And because of God's guidance and your support, we've been winning!

Without your help, none of this would be possible.

Stand with your brothers and sisters

When you stand with ADF International, you are standing up for persecuted Christians in India and around the world. People like Donald Ossewaarde, an American missionary to Russia. Donald was convicted of "illegal missionary activity" under Russia's "anti-terror" legislation. His crime? Hosting peaceful Sunday worship services in his home.

Or the 23 Catholic Bishops, currently under investigation in Mexico for defending the biblical definition of marriage as between one man and one woman. Or the pastor in

Turkey, who simply sought to plant a church but has been denied permission for over a decade.

These trends should concern us all because fellow members of the Body of Christ are suffering. And they need your help.
