# Messenger of Peace

Members and Friends;

The Concordia Journal came out this week and Rev. Dr. Dale Meyer, President of Concordia Seminary in a sermon at Multiethnic Seminary wrote the following:

"Where does the worship of God take place?

Most of us would probably say in a church in the divine service, in those appointed times when the Spirit uses Word and Sacrament to nurture our saving faith in Jesus. That is true but it is too restricted an understanding of worship. It suggests that the first three commandments, our duties toward God make the rest of the commandments less important. Phillip Melanchthon, Martin Luther's right hand man wrote, "We should learn that works of the Second Table are truly the worship of God, that is, when our works are guided by the fear of God and by faith.

When we followers of Jesus give attention to the bodily needs of people who don't know Jesus, the fifth commandment. . . When we the followers of Jesus give attention to the family life or broken family lives of others, the sixth commandment. . . When we give attention to the economic needs of others the seventh commandment. . . When we give attention to the reputation of other people, the eighth commandment. . . And when we do so because we fear and love our God and Savior above all things, then we are truly worshipping God.

It is too small a thing to compartmentalize the worship of God only to the First Table of the Law or to the Sunday morning hour. The Sunday morning hour is important for our continued growth in the faith, but God is also deserving of our worship during the week. Jesus tells us to "love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength," and then adds "Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no commandment greater than these. (Mk 12:30-31)"

As we contemplate the celebration of our Independence Day, we might also think about the purpose of the United States and our collective relationship to God. There is a poem I used in Crossways Bible Studies when we were studying the prophets and their instruction to Israel regarding their responsibilities to God and to their neighbor. The poem speaks to contemporary America.

#### A Charge to America

I urge thee on thy knees to bow, America, And to recall thine old-time vow, America, God gave thee as a place of rest A refuge for the earth's oppressed Oh, tell me hast thou stood the test, America?

I charge thee in this solemn hour, America,
Trust not in thine own paltry power, America,
Remember that in God we trust
Return to Him the nation must
Lest thou be humbled in the dust, America!
