# Messenger of Peace

Dear Members and Friends,

As I write this the Old Testament text for this coming Sunday, August 19 is from Joshua 24. It reads:

"Now fear the LORD and serve him with all faithfulness. Throw away the gods your ancestors worshiped beyond the Euphrates River and in Egypt, and serve the LORD. But if serving the LORD seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your ancestors served beyond the Euphrates, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

Joshua led the people to rededicate themselves to the God who had brought them out of Egypt, led them through the wilderness and was now bringing them to the brink of entering the Promised Land. He sought to encourage them in their walk with their Lord. As we begin a new fall season, I would like to encourage you in your walk with Jesus your Lord and Savior.

Here are some practical ways that you can recommit yourselves to Jesus. There are others, but this will help you get started. First these are ways you yourself can grow personally in your relationship with Jesus.

- \* Plan to attend worship more this year than last.
- \* Get involved in a regular Bible Study
- \* Hold family devotions on a more regular basis
- \* Re-examine your financial commitment to the Lord's Kingdom.

Ways you can help others grow in their relationship to Jesus.

- \* Volunteer to serve on the Altar Guild, as a Greeter, or Usher
- \* Serve on a committee or board of the Church
- \* Visit someone who needs God's care and concern
- \* Invite some of your unchurched friends to come to church with you.

There are many other ways you can be involved in the work of the kingdom. Jesus has called you in your baptism, he has equipped you with special gifts and talents and he wants you to put those gifts and talents to work in his kingdom. He wants to work through you. He wants to give your words and actions his power. Let him go to work in your life. You may be surprised at what he can do through you.

Greetings,

Rev. Daniel Paul, and the three pastors he instructed in Nord Est Haiti (Yves, Richard, and Pepe) are going to a "Pastors' Retreat" in Jacmael (southern Haiti) this week. In Cap Haitian (northcentral Haiti) they will be joined by Rev.

Elonia Bernard and several pastors from his area. Reverend Paul will be speaking at the retreat. His topic is "The Means of Grace." These opportunities do not occur very often. We pray for their fellowship and safe travel.

Before he goes on this trip, however, he has some details to settle. When he called, I asked how things were going, and he responded, "Oh, things are not going well at all. We had an accident over the weekend. A hired worker fell, and we took him to the hospital, but three hours later, he died." Rev. Paul went on to explain that this worker was married and had six children. "We have our lawyer, and it was an accident, but there will be some investigation." He then explained that it is their responsibility to take care of the funeral, because his family cannot provide for it. There is also the responsibility to care for and provide for the dead man's family. These "responsibilities" might be official Haitian law or cultural expectations, but they can be applied to Christian care for orphans and widows--James 1:27, "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world."


Another detail is securing some furnishings to complete the classroom construction at the school. With more older students, the cost of education is greater. NEHLM's \$20 a month sponsorship for a student greatly eases the financial strain. NEHLM is also working on a giving option especially crafted for groups or schools, to adopt/ sponsor a class. Watch for details to come in the upcoming newsletter and on the website. We praise God for all the resources we receive for the ministry.

Mentioning resources, the NEHLM officers are working with LWML member on a grant proposal to the National Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) to begin work on a worship center. At the present facility, people regularly have to stand outside. Another concern at the present facility is that it is inside the walls of the girls' orphanage complex; it is a bit awkward to welcome the community into their living quarters.

Even though they could use more rain, Rev. Paul reported, "We are able to be harvesting bananas and plantains. More things will be ready soon."
