### The Life and Times of Rene & Shirley Pedraza...

It is always a joy to welcome new members into Peace Lutheran Church.

- 5. Work/train church members who might like to help; but do not know protocols.
- 6. Gather congregational input as to their favorite hymns/music and incorporate them in the service especially some children's favorites maybe sung before Children's Church.
- 7. Children's Minute with pastor, maybe before the benediction 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays.
- 8. Youth acolyte 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays.

### COMMUNITY OUT REACH AS A CHURCH BODY

- 1. Billboard advertising in town, example Come join our family with a picture of the church and congregation.
- 2. Sandwich boards placed 1 block north and 1 block south of the church on the sidewalk.

### TAX NEWS FOR CHARITABLE GIVERS

The new provision encourages individuals to contribute to religious, charitable and educational organizations by creating a new "above" the line" deduction (i.e. for taxpayers who take the standard deduction). This deduction will permit them to deduct up to \$300 of annual monetary contributions. This is applicable for tax years beginning after 2019.

### Reflections of my trip to Kenya March 28, 2020 By Glenn Stocker

I understand there were many prayers and concerns going up for my safety in my "mission" to Kenya, Africa back in March. I felt the prayers answered as the Lord guided me very safely along the way. I am so thankful for my good friends. You are a joy in my life and much appreciated. I am also thankful for your donation of supplies to make this trip successful. They were well received.

I left Yakima on Wednesday, March 11<sup>th</sup>, going first to Seattle, then for an 8 hour layover in Paris before landing in Nairobi on March 13<sup>th</sup>. A taxi friend I had known from the past met me and took me to my friend's home. After a few hours of greetings with her and her two charming children, we went to NURU (the Lutheran Hour Ministries office) in Nairobi to drop off our first set of items, primarily used eyeglasses and hand sanitizers, then to the guest house inn to settle in and make phone calls.

On Sunday, my friend and I attended the Lutheran Church that is next to the national head-quarters of our partner Lutheran Church of Kenya. We were pleased to meet Rev. Shauen Trump, the Lutheran Director of Missions coordinating for our U.S. offices and a former resident with his parents who live near Tacoma, WA. We also met John Maina, the former director of NURU who now works for the Lutheran office headquarters of Kenya. He also was the guest preacher and did an outstanding sermon on the woman at the well with Jesus. We joined our fellow members for a communion service. Afterwards I was asked to introduce myself and I then brought greetings from our fellow brother and sister members in America.

On Monday, my friend was my chauffeur and guide as we drove to Western Kenya, stopping off at Nakuru where we met Violet Gitonga, the administrator of an orphanage and school that I accompanied Dr. Ross Bethel to some years ago on a medical mission. We gave her items for the school, as the school was closed due to government orders, like in the U.S.

From there we went further west to Kisumu with stops at Point of Grace Academy, a Lutheran orphanage and school set up by Rev. Dennis Meeker and wife Lorna. Here again the facility was closed due to government orders, except for a small staff of children and adults. This 600 student academy is in the process of also building a high school. It shelters children from age 6 months through high school. School items were also left with Rev. Meeker.

From there we went to Kisumu to find housing for the night and to meet with Gabriel and Elizabeth Mala, a pastor friend of a fellow Gideon brother from Zillah that sent items and study bibles for Rev. Mala. The next day we met with Rev. Dr. David Chuchu, the Lutheran Bishop at his new hotel and conference center for lunch and also gave him items for his outreach humanitarian programs.

On the road on Wednesday we headed south and met with Rev. Mishak Ngare our Lutheran pastor acquaintance who showed us his recently built church in a rural area. He still has a need for pews, etc. He said people do not come much if they need to stand for services. His membership is about 100. Afterwards his family hosted us for a lunch and extended visit. By evening time we continued on to my friend's home in western Kenya for the night.

The next day we got up early and two hours later got on a ferry boarded on Lake Victoria to visit a "Sister" friend and family. To my surprise they were Roman Catholic with the Sister being a R. C. Nun. It was an all day visit with travel and we arrived back home at 10 p.m. The next day we visited areas from the past like Migori, Kenya and visited villages and areas of development that was a major change from past visits I had made with medical teams.

Finally back to Nairobi on Sunday. In the meantime we got word of major shut downs of the airports and were attempting to get earlier flights back to the U.S. It was impossible to get through to the airlines but my daughters, Susan and Shereen, were able to get me a flight on Tuesday on Ethiopian Airlines that took me to Addas Abbaba and then to Dublin. Following that it was on to Chicago before getting to Seattle and Yakima by midnight Wednesday, which enabled me to bypass any stops in Europe. I was several days earlier than was originally planned, but I was home looking forward to my wife's cooking. But now I am in "quarantine" at home for two weeks and following government orders.

Overall I think I was able to deliver over 250 pairs of eyeglasses, nearly a 100 t-shirts, a dozen soccer balls, hundreds of pens and pencils, the 4 study bibles, 4 large packages of hand sanitizers, and some other smaller items to the orphanages and schools. I felt God's guiding hand and comfort wherever I went. They were a very friendly people and many invited me to come back again.

I felt it was a blessing to be with my fellow Christian family in Kenya, to worship with them, and I could feel the Lord guiding and being with me the entire time. I had no fears or concerns as we know the Lord is with us wherever we are. To God be the glory as we serve Him in our love for our fellows in Christ.
