The LHM Mission: Bringing Christ to the Nations—and the Nations to the Church

LHM plays a vital role in helping spread the Gospel message all over the world with 34 ministry centers on six continents reaching into more than 50 countries, often bringing Christ to places where no other Christian evangelistic organizations are present. LHM's flagship ministry, The Lutheran Hour®, airs weekly on more than 1,800 radio stations and the AFN.



LLL/LHM Districts

The Lutheran Laymen's League (LLL) is divided into regional districts and district zones, each zone having ambassadors for each of their zone churches. Districts partner with an Intn'I LHM ministry center. Districts have the opportunity to choose from a variety of ministry center needs, allowing them to reach out with effective ministry to the people of that region.

Global Focus: LHM-Mexico

Maria is 33 years old and has an 11-year-old daughter. She is from Mexico but is currently working in the United States as a teacher's assistant. She follows the LHM-Mexico Facebook page and reached out to the staff after watching one of their Facebook live videos. The Facebook live topic was violence, and being a previous victim, it really touched Maria's heart. She has talked with LHM-Mexico staff several times and has started attending women's Bible studies before being referred to an LCMS congregation. Maria desires to have a relationship with God and is enjoying learning more about Him each day.

The Lutheran Hour Ministries ministry center in Mexico is locally known as **Cristo Para Todas las Naciones (Christ for all Nations).** LHM—Mexico works closely with local Lutheran missions and pastors to support the outreach of each mission church, and to build a collaborative effort among all Lutheran agencies working in Mexico.

Bible Correspondence Courses are an important part of the outreach and work of LHM because people in Mexico are largely unfamiliar with the Bible. Currently, LHM—Mexico is using six different courses. LHM supports the church through training and education of lay ministers. One group of facilitators uses the LHM office as their training center and material resource office as they study the training course developed through the Hispanic Institute of Theology from the Concordia Seminary in St. Louis.

LHM—Mexico ministry programs:

Because of Covid-19 restrictions much of the in person outreach is done with social distancing in place. This reduces the number of people that can be reached each day. However, use of social media has helped reach those who cannot be ministered to in person.

DIGITAL OUTREACH. Young adults gravitate to the internet seeking help, including millions who are curious—or have doubts— about Christianity. The Vivenciar.net website serves as our hub for digital outreach in Mexico and throughout Latin America. Through Vivenciar, we establish online relationships with individuals and provide biblically-based answers for their lives. Eventually, as God opens their hearts, we share the Gospel with them and guide them into church.
