# Messenger of Peace

Dear Members and Friends,

The 4<sup>th</sup> of July falls on a Sunday this year which gives us the chance to celebrate God's gracious gifts to our country as well as his continual gifts to us individually. Of course, receiving God's gifts through our government and nation also then makes us indebted to them. Celebrating our nation only when we receive the gifts of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness, and many others, obligates us to respect, honor, and obey our government when they ask things of us. St Paul exhorts us in Romans 13:

Let every person be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God. <sup>2</sup> Therefore whoever resists the authorities resists what God has appointed, and those who resist will incur judgment. <sup>3</sup> For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval, <sup>4</sup> for he is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer. <sup>5</sup> Therefore one must be in subjection, not only to avoid God's wrath but also for the sake of conscience. <sup>6</sup> For because of this you also pay taxes, for the authorities are ministers of God, attending to this very thing. <sup>7</sup> Pay to all what is owed to them: taxes to whom taxes are owed, revenue to whom revenue is owed, respect to whom respect is owed, honor to whom honor is owed.

Luther in his explanation of the 4<sup>th</sup> commandment in his Large Catechism also tells us:

The same also is to be said of obedience to civil government, which (as we have said) is all embraced in the estate of fatherhood and extends farthest of all relations. For here the father is not one of a single family, but of as many people as he has tenants, citizens, or subjects. For through them, as through our parents, God gives to us food, house and home, protection and security. Therefore, since they bear such name and title with all honor as their highest dignity, it is our duty to honor them and to esteem them great as the dearest treasure and the most precious jewel upon earth. He, now, who is obedient

here, is willing and ready to serve, and cheerfully does all that pertains to honor, knows that he is pleasing God and that he will receive joy and happiness for his reward. If he will not do it in love, but despises and resists [authority] or rebels, let him also know, on the other hand, that he shall have no favor nor blessing.......Why think you, is the world now so full of unfaithfulness, disgrace, calamity, and murder, but because everyone desires to be his own master and free from the emperor, to care nothing for any one, and do what pleases him? Therefore, God punishes one knave by another, so that, when you defraud and despise your master, another comes and deals in like manner with you, yea, in your household you must suffer ten times more from wife, children, or servants. (Luther's Large Catechism para 150-154)

May God bless your celebration of the birth of our nation and help and empower us to be more than complainers and seek to work to resolve our disagreements with charity and integrity.

## Haiti Mission Update...

Greetings,

I returned from our trip to Haiti on the 26th of May and continue to find myself sharing stories. I appreciate the opportunity to share with people who are interested. I am honored to be involved with such conscientious people of this ministry, which includes you.

We were in Haiti during May, the rainy season, but we received only a couple of light rains. The biggest was during the second half of a soccer match with College Evangelique le Lutherien de Ouanaminthe (CELO is the K-11th grade school of this ministry) and another team. We got wet with this constant light rain. The opponents won the soccer match 7 to 2; they were older and able to regularly practice on the game field, a well-worn turfed field. That was the first time the CELO team was on a standard-sized field that wasn't just dirt. CELO's fans were numerous, outnumbering the opponents by about 20 to 1. They were very supportive and celebrative with each of the two scores and didn't seem to mind the rain.

Rev. Paul reported that they received a very good hard rain on June 8th and some other rain before that. He anticipates that the gardens will be growing well.

Please continue to pray for these, and other, Christians in Haiti. They consistently demonstrate a vibrant love for worship and the grace that God provides. The country of Haiti also needs our prayers as there is fairly intense unrest due in part to a president who remains in office after his term has ended; the country has not been able to hold an election. Political instability has regularly hampered this country.

The satellite ministry in the Middle East and North Africa has been producing video programming in the Arabic language on the SAT-7 satelite. This was a great success and the partnership began to produce programming for children called "Golpand" in the Farsi language on the SAT-7 PARS. Now because of your support of LHM another Farsi language broadcast called "Hashtag" for older children and youth is being produced. These weekly programs have a bible story and helps the children to apply lesson to their lives from that story. Last fall the Hashtag staff asked its audience to create artwork that would help the children imagine what life would be like after Covid-19. One mother shared on air how her daughter watches the show and has learned to pray by listening to the show and now prays with her friends and relatives.

In addition to reaching children and youth with the Gospel we are also reaching out to young adults.

Rashid is 22 years old and lives in a city with no church. He has been interested in Christianity but has not yet met anyone who could help him understand the Christian faith. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, Rashid is living with his family who practice a non-Christian religion. One day, he came across an LHM social media page and arranged a virtual meeting with an LHM staff member in the Middle East and North Africa who was able to answer some of his questions and send him lessons for their Bible Correspondence Courses (BCC)\*. Rashid is looking forward to studying the lessons and learning more about Christianity.

### **Packing**

From children to seniors, people pack shoebox gifts (/operationchristmas-child/pack-a-shoe-box/) each year to bless children in need

around the world. Parents often use the project to teach their kids about giving. Year-round volunteers (/operation-christmas-child/volunteer-year-round/) support these efforts across the country.



### Collecting

Churches and groups of all sizes collect boxes (/operationchristmas-child/project-leader/) from their communities. Some churches also serve as drop-off

locations (/operation-christmas-child/drop-offlocations/) for shoeboxes the third week of November every year.

### Shipping

Thousands of volunteers (/operation-christmaschild/volunteer-at-a-shoebox-processing-center/) serve annually inspecting and preparing shoeboxes for international shipping. Every hour work stops for a few minutes to pray for the children who will receive the boxes.

### Worldwide Distribution

Long before shoeboxes arrive in more than 100 countries, volunteer National Leadership Teams train pastors and community leaders who want to

share the message of the Gospel (/operationchristmas-child/eternal-impact/) and bless children. The leaders learn how to host child-friendly outreach events, and how to implement The Greatest Journey follow-up discipleship program.
