That's why it doesn't take much digging to realize that Christ is working mightily in the LCMS and that we can, by His grace, do more together than we can accomplish in dark corners working by ourselves.

Just take a look at all of our partners. They serve in their own alphabet soup variety of vocations, from global missions to health benefits, from investments and loans to liberal arts education, from partner church bodies to the Synod's archives. And they do it all for the well-being and care of individual members of the LCMS, each of her congregations, all of the 35 districts, even the Synod at-large.
