#### WHAT'S THE SPIRIT GOT TO DO WITH IT?

May 24<sup>th</sup> is Pentecost, the day when we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on God's church. Pentecost is one of the major festivals of the Christian church.

What's the Spirit got to do with it? Everything! We don't become Christians by our own power. No one can say, "It's my decision. I can make myself a believer in Christ." Only the Holy Spirit gives faith in Christ. Jesus died and rose in our place to secure for each of us forgiveness and eternal life. The redemption Christ accomplished for all is applied to us individually when the Spirit brings us to faith. The Spirit who is "the Lord and giver of life," works to give us new life as we die to sin and rise to life with him.

We can't live as Christians by our own power. No one can say, "Now that I've become a Christian, I'll just do this Christian life thing by myself. Jesus leave me alone, and let me be a Christian in my own way." Apparently, many think they can remain Christian apart from God. But Luther in his explanation to the third article of the creed makes clear that we are entirely dependent on the Holy Spirit. He says: "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him." Some may say, "Well, those are just Luther's words, show me in scripture." Well, St. Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 2:14-16:

The man without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him, and he cannot understand them, because they are spiritually discerned. The spiritual man makes judgments about all things, but he himself is not subject to any man's judgment: "For who has known the mind of the Lord that he may instruct him?" But we have the mind of Christ.

We need the spirit not only to begin our life with God in Baptism but throughout our life. God promises in his word to give us the Spirit through his word and through the sacraments. He does not promise to give us the Spirit in any other way. Therefore, for the Christian to remain strong in the Spirit he or she must continually be renewed by the Spirit through the only ways that God promises to give the Spirit: His Word and His Sacraments.

Listen to the Spirit when he prods you. He enables you to be more like Christ every day. Let him fill you up with the good things of God. Follow his direction and leading. And let him use you so that your life becomes exciting work for God.

The Holy Spirit is important in our lives. The church wouldn't be here and we wouldn't be here today without the Holy Spirit. It is only by the Spirit that we will be able to remain close to God throughout life; that we may be close to him forever in heaven.

In February 2013, a ten-member Lutheran Hour Ministries' team from Saint Paul Lutheran Church in Mt. Prospect, IL, visited Prich Lutheran Church in a remote village of Kompot Province, Cambodia. During their time in Cambodia, they

helped build two Sunday school classrooms for the church.

Now, two years later, nearly 50 children are studying Khmer and English languages in these two classrooms. The facilities have made it possible for LH—Cambodia's staff to work with the church's pastor to help local children learn about Jesus through Bible Correspondence Courses. Through this ministry, 29 children were led to be baptized in November 2014!




Access the "Legacy Toolkit"!
