HOLY COMMUNION at PEACE



We celebrate Holy Communion on the 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays of the month. We believe that Scripture teaches that the Lord's Supper is a precious gift in which Christ comes to us. We believe that, as Jesus said, His body and blood are truly in the Sacrament. We believe that we are sinners forgiven by Jesus Christ. We repent of our sins. We are baptized children of the one true God. As we partake of this Sacrament, we express our unity in faith. We come at Jesus' invitation, for He is the Host.

Because the Bible also teaches (1 Corinthians 11:27-29) that this Sacrament may be spiritually harmful to those who are unprepared or lack true faith in Christ, our congregation practices close communion. Any who are not yet a member of the congregation, and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked to speak with our pastor prior to communing.

Even if you do not commune, you are welcome to come forward for a blessing. Simply come forward and, when kneeling, cross your arms over your chest. Non-communing children are also welcome at the altar.

About the Cover: VDMA, a popular insignia of the Reformation, is an acronym for Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternum, which is Latin for "the Word of the Lord remains forever" (see Isaiah 40:8; 1 Peter 1:25). Amid strife and trouble from all directions, the reformers held that the Word would remain. Nothing can quash God's Word. St. Peter directly applied the words of Isaiah to the Good News of Jesus' death and resurrection. Nothing in this world can take Jesus away from us. Even if everything else is gone, the Word will always remain. The Reformation is a call to confidence, consolation, and courage in nothing other than the Word of the Lord. "The grass withers, and the flower falls, but the word of the Lord remains forever" (1 Peter 1:24–25).



Membership Covenant

In order for the congregation and the Leadership to deal effectively with issues in the congregation, the following guidelines are to be followed:

- 1. All members affirm their right to express their opinions about the life and ministry of the congregation.
- 2. The congregation operates with a direct democracy form of government that allows members to share their opinions directly with the pastor, leadership, committees, and congregational meetings.
- 3. When members of the congregation express an opinion to leadership, the leadership person shall ask, "What would you like me to do with this information?"
- 4. When members of the congregation express an opinion to a leadership team member, the member shall be invited to bring the information/opinion to the next council meeting. The time and date shall be given.
- 5. If the member does not wish to appear in person, the leadership member shall ask the member for permission to use their name in reporting. If permission is not given, the leadership member shall say, "I'm sorry, but I will not be able to report this to the council since we do not deal with anonymous letters or comments."
- 6. If permission is given, the leadership member shall report the information/opinion to the leadership team and use the members name.
- 7. At his/her discretion, a leadership member may ask that the member refer this issue to another member for presentation.
- 8. Each issue shall be placed on the agenda and written in the minutes along with the action taken by the leadership. Action may include: "Received as information," "Pastor and /or President to visit member and report at next meeting," etc.
- 9. Opinions may be shared in writing with the council and shall be handled in the above mentioned manner if the letter or statement is signed. While the covenant uses language regarding the leadership team, the same procedures apply to all boards and committees. May the Spirit give us grace to grow as a healthy congregation
