I hope you and your family had a wonderful Christmas celebrating the gift God has given to us in his only begotten Son.

Steve Sinclair and I were discussing the fact that we have covered Mormonism and Islam during our Bible Classes this past year, perhaps it is time to look at our own history as Lutherans. With that in mind we will be offering the following.

Steve Sinclair will be leading a Bible study on Sunday mornings on Martin Luther. This is a video-based study from Lutheran Hour Ministries and goes over the life of Martin Luther. It should be a good historic look into the man who started the Reformation and was instrumental in its development.

I will be leading a Wednesday Bible Study on the Augsburg Confession at 11 am (Bethlehem) and at 6:30 pm (Peace). The presentation of the Augsburg Confession on Jun 25, 1530, was a decisive moment, one long in coming. Leading up to the Imperial Meeting at Augsburg Nine years earlier on April 21, 1521 at the Imperial Meeting in Worms, Emperor Charles V had listened as Martin Luther refused to recant his teachings saying, "I cannot and will not recant. I cannot do otherwise. Here I stand. God help me. Amen."

Now at Augsburg Charles was watching as the most important rulers in his German territories confessed their faith openly and courageously in spite of the threats to their lives from both the government and the Church.

The Augsburg Confession is one of the foundational documents of the Lutheran Church along with the large and small Catechisms. Come and learn more about the church that you are a part of, and fellowship with others as we confess who we are and what we believe.


Mission Jar

quarter in the "Mission Jar". At the end of the year the change will be counted and given to a local charity.


