

Using Luther's Catechisms for Lent

The concept for our midweek Lenten series was inspired by the Book of Concord:

Such matters also concern the laity and the salvation of their souls. Therefore we also confess Dr. Luther's Small and Large Catechisms as they are included in Luther's works. They are "the layman's Bible" because everything necessary for a Christian to know for salvation is included in them, which is handled more extensively in the Holy Scriptures. (FC Ep | 5)

As part of our Lenten emphasis I would like to ask every member of the congregation to make the catechism a part of their daily Lenten routine. Each week we will focus on one of the six chief parts of Luther's Small and Large Catechism. So in preparation for our time together on Wednesday evening I ask you to read through the catechism topic of the week. Consider the following:

Spiritual Growth in Lent: Many people choose to give up something for Lent. Instead, you may want to take on something for your Lenten discipline. You may want to read the Six Chief Parts of Christian Doctrine from Luther's Small and/or Large Catechism each day according to the following schedule:

Week 1 —The Ten Commandments

Week 2 — The Apostles' Creed

Week 3 —The Lord's Prayer

Week 4 —The Sacrament of Holy Baptism

Week 5 — Confession

Week 6 —The Sacrament of the Altar

5. Lenten Midweek 5: We Are Forgiven: The Office of the Keys, John 20:19–23

6. Lenten Midweek 6: We Eat a Holy Supper: The Sacrament of the Altar, Matthew 26:26-28

The following article was taken from the October edition of the Stewardship Newsletter.

Dear Editor:

There is an increasing tendency on the part of some Christians to take the attitude that "I will give to the church only if my money is not used for some radical cause of which I disapprove." Some do not give at all, for fear their money will be misused.

Giving money to the church is giving it back to God. It is the recognition that the goods and property we have comes from God and thus a part of these should be given to the worship of God and to the church that represents him. This is simply a recognition of God's ownership of all things in life and a proof of personal appreciation for having received them from him.

When we give to the church, we are not giving to the particular people who administer God's works in this world. **Our only motive should be to promote God's work.** When we give generously out of love for God, we live in relation to him and therefore will receive our reward from him, not from the temporal administrators.

The efficacy of our gift does not depend on whether the human agent administers the funds according to our reasoned conviction. Regardless of how the money is used, we have returned our share to God. The human agent has the responsibility, and will be accountable to God for his or her stewardship, not yours.


