LITURGICAL SONGS FROM ANTIQUITY: THE "AGNUS DEI"

We continue our examination of the ancient hymns that are incorporated in the liturgy of the church.

This brief hymn has been a part of the liturgy since the beginning of the Lutheran Church and has been placed in the liturgy as a prayer recognizing the spiritual connection with Jesus, the Lamb of God that takes away the sin of the world, whose body and blood will be received in the Sacrament of the Altar.

Originally, in years prior to the forming of the Lutheran faith and its liturgies, it was sung by the choir as the priests were blessing the Host (Bread). Lutherans moved it to just prior to the Distribution. As you know, there are many different versions of this including the hymn, "Lamb of God, Pure and Holy'. (See LSB 434.)

It is based on the declaration that was proclaimed by John the Baptist as He pointed to Jesus, who had come to be baptized by him. (See John 1:29.) Recognized is the work of Jesus who sacrifices Himself for the sake of reconciling us to the Father – all according to God's Will, His plan of salvation. Eating His body, drinking His blood brings us the forgiveness of sins. We know, as Luther would remind us, that where there is forgiveness of sins there is the assurance of eternal life and life as faith is strengthened.

Next time when we sing this hymn reflect upon these things.

Next month we will focus our attention on the "Nunc Dimittis".

The book we will discuss is "A Fall of Marigold," by Susan Meissner.


The Book begins in September 1911 at New York's Ellis Island Harbor.

Through it all, we have become known in our community as "the church who serves the 4th of July Pancake Breakfast". We see familiar faces and yet watch as families grow and change every year. For many of us, it has become something we look forward to every year.

This is my final year chairing this event and community outreach project.
