From the Pastor

THE PRAYER OF HOPE

"Yes, I am coming soon. Amen. Come, Lord Jesus." Revelation 22:20

The Revelation of St. John is a book of hope. Though its contents seem frightening, it holds out the absolute promise and hope for God's people. Jesus, Himself, promises that He will come again and bring not only the close of this age

but also that He will take His people home to be with Him in heaven for eternity. To this promise, the Church cries out, "Amen! Come, Lord Jesus!" I think it would be fair to say that the Christian would add, "Come quickly!!"

In this month of December, we begin and end in the words and promises of God that inculcate absolute certainty and hope.

Advent reminds us of God's threefold coming. First, the promise of His second return in all His glory. Second, that He comes in the proclaiming of His Word during this season of grace so that others might come to believe and so that believers remain in hope. Finally, we are reminded of His coming into the flesh when He, Himself, came in the flesh and walked on this earth and offered Himself up to reconcile God and man as was promised Adam and Eve in the Garden and echoed throughout the Old Testament era and celebrated in this New Testament era.

Christmas is the celebration of that third coming. We celebrate the incarnation of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. It, too, is a celebration of the hope that is alive in us and for the sake of all. This hope is made certain on account of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection. Take away that gift for all nations and there would be no need to celebrate. The motivation for the giving of gifts is on account of the greatest gift given to us by God our Father in His Son, Jesus.

During the last several months we briefly explored many of Jesus' parables. They serve as instruction guiding our lives that are offered up to Him for the sake of His kingdom work. These parables also serve as assurances of hope. That hope serves as empowerment during our pilgrimage here on earth.

The last day of the month concludes with celebrating God's faithfulness in providing for all of our needs over this past year and anticipates His continued faithfulness in the year(s) to come. As the hymn so wonderfully expresses...

"Our God, our help in ages past, Our hope for years to come, Still be our guard while troubles last An our eternal home.

As you can see, all of the themes of this month come full round in this simple verse. May God richly bless you and your family with a Christ-centered Christmas and Blessed New Year!

Also, the remaining bazaar funds are used to purchase non-budgeted items for our church. Over past years we have purchased such items as new silverware for the kitchen, a push lawnmower, furniture for Youth Director's office, cabinets for the library, a grill for the pancake breakfast, a full projector system and laptop for the fellowship hall, we paid for about half of the new freezer and refrigerators, and we gave \$6,000 to the Foundations for the Future fund.
