"DRY BONES?: FROM DESPAIR TO REVIVAL"

Read Ezekiel 37:1-14.

Two challenges comes to us while here on earth... Overconfidence and Despair. Both have the propensity to lead to disaster.

The children of Israel had become overconfident. It lead them to reject their God and brought on themselves devastating consequences. They found themselves as a conquered people exiled to a foreign land as a result of a total defeat. Their beloved city Jerusalem and the temple to be completely destroyed. Despair was consuming them.

It is in this context that God once again speaks to His people through a vision of His servant, the prophet Ezekiel. The vision is entitled, "The Valley of Dry Bones".

All is dead, the vision of dry bones is shown to Ezekiel. Imagine the vision as he saw it. No skin, no breath, only dry bones. A question is posed to him as you read in the text. Ezekiel speaks correctly in that only God knows and can make the dry bones live.

Indeed, God does just that. He assembles the bones and gives them the breath of life. New life is brought forward all by God's power through His Spirit. Ezekiel is a witness to this great miracle.

The purpose of this vision was to remove despair and usher in revival. The House of Israel would be restored by almighty God. He would work this on behalf of His people. He, namely God Almighty, would restore His people. They would return to Jerusalem. The walls and city would be restored. The temple would be rebuilt. Israel would be revived.

This wonderful vision addresses our overconfidence that often leads to rejecting God resulting in despair. Yet, He brings new life to us in the forgiveness of sins. We are revived. His Word and Sacraments re-establishes us and we are once again restored in our relationship with us.

The same can be applied to our congregation. We went through a time of despair. By God's grace He will revive us and we can once again go forward revived by Him. ON FAITH - Part 3: "Growing in Faith: Blessings of Our Lord"

Over the last few months, we've been diving into the topic of Christian "Faith." This month we will conclude this dive by looking at how faith grows, and what a wonderful blessing of God it is that HE grows our faith in Him, which in turn increases our love for those around us.

Our Christian faith is always meant to be growing. If you look at Confirmation for instance, the goal of youth confirming their faith is about taking their baptismal faith up with their own hands. There is a hand-off of sorts from the parents who brought their child to the font to receive baptism, who made vows in their child's stead, even as their Heavenly Father gifted them with His Holy Spirit. Confirmation is the beginning of personal discipleship for the young learner.

Scripture speaks fairly clearly time & again that faith does not remain static, but is meant to grow and develop. In his letter to the Thessalonian church, St. Paul compliments them on the evidence he'd heard of their faith maturing, "We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of every one of you for one another is increasing." (2 Thess. 1:3)

As a seedling grows into a tree, changes take place. The delicate/fragile seedling's stalk can break and it can be easily bent to grow into a distorted shape. It is more likely to survive if it is protected and nurtured. Then, as it grows, it becomes stronger, its branches fill out and provide shade, it becomes sturdier to weather the elements, and in time it produces fruit.

The faith of a new Christian, whether a little child or a newly converted adult, is much like that seedling. An immature faith can easily be bent of broken by the forces around it. It needs to be protected & nurtured by God's Word & Sacraments in an environment of faithful believers. In 1 Thess. 3:10, Paul confesses, "We pray most earnestly night and day that we may see you face to face and supply whatever is Lacking in your faith." As faith grows, Christians share their growing faith, which in turn leads to more growth. As an evangelist, Paul had great appreciation for this, "I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ." (Phil 6) Mature faith holds up to the storms of life and does not waver even when the future looks bleak. In Romans 5:3-5, Paul explains, "We rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." As we grow in our faith in Christ, those around will see the evidence of that growing faith through the Christian love we show to others. Paul commended the Colossians for their faith, writing, "We herd of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints." (Col 1:4)

Faith grows by the power of the Holy Spirit as He works through study of God's Word and the encouragement & influence of other believers as together they share God's Word in Worship & Fellowship. God declares the importance of knowing His Word in Deuteronomy 11:18-21, "You shall therefore lay up thesewords of mine in your heart and in your soul, and

you shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. You shall teac h them to your children, talking of them when you are sitting in your house,

and when you are walking by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, that your days and the days of your children may be multiplied in the land that the LORD swore to your fathers to give them, as long as the heavens are above the earth." God's people need to take His command literally, and seek to do as He instructs. One of the most heinous temptations of Satan, the world, and our sinful flesh is to think we know everything about God's Word & the message it brings, or that we are able to reach a point where we know 'enough'. We can never assume that children will learn about God when they are ready, or that our own personal Bible study is not important to our lives as Christians. However, we can rejoice that God makes His Word clear in Scripture, and that He calls & Commands us to study His Word of life with one another, and that He promises to bless us through studying His Word together. We can be assured that time spent in Bible Study is never wasted!

On top of that, God has placed the Christians that surround us in our church, workplaces, community & neighborhoods are there for a reason. St. Paul often comments on how Christians build one another up in

faith, acknowledging that other believers uplifted him in his own faith walk. He knew that he had an impact on the faith of others, and often spoke of how much he desired to meet together, "For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gifts to strengthen you-that is, that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine." (Rom 1:11-12)

Faith grows through imitating Christ, and even the lives of the faithful. Not that even faithful believers are sinless, but Christian leaders & mentors do much teaching by their example. Paul writes in 1 Thess. 1:6-8, "And you became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you received the word in much affliction, with the joy of the Holy Spirit, so that you became an example to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. For not only has the word of the Lord sounded forth from you in Macedonia and Achaia, but your faith in God has gone forth everywhere, so that we need not say anything." And the writer of Hebrews stated, "Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God. Consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith." (Heb 13:7)

When Christians become complacent in their faith, the danger of falling away from Christ is apparent. Hebrews 6:1-12 warns believers of not desiring spiritual maturity, which can lead to spiritual death. Some people are content with the basics and fail to see the importance of exercising their faith by putting it into action. "Therefore let us leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and go on to maturity...So that you may not be sluggish, but imitators of those who through faith and patience inherit the promises." (Heb 6:1,12) "If you are not firm in faith, you will not be firm at all." (Isaiah 7:9)

Although we can't see if someone else has faith, God admonishes each of us to look at our own hearts and appraise our faith regularly, so that we may be lead to spiritual growth & action. We are justified by faith alone, but not by faith that is alone. Faith in Jesus Christ results in Christlike action. We can't earn salvation by works, and God doesn't need our works, but our neighbor does. Those around us need God's love to overflow from us to them, which happens as we actively do good for others, especially when they don't deserve it. And sometimes we do falter in our faith, drift away from God, and our lives spin off-course. Yet, when this happens, God calls us to repent and turn from our destructive course to once again take up Jesus' invitation, "Come to Me." If we never review our faith or ignore the warning signs (lack of concern for others, actions that show no love), disaster can result. Paul wrote to Timothy, "By rejecting this, some have made shipwreck of their faith." (1 Tim 1:19) Yet, when we see the warning signs, we can have hope that God has not abandoned us! God even uses our weaknesses of faith to benefit others.

Faith protects against the attacks of Satan, who will not rest until he's done as much damage as he can to God's creation, and he measures his victory in souls that refuse/reject saving faith in Christ. Faith arms us for battle with Satan, the world, & our sinful flesh, enabling us to rely on power that is not our own. St. Paul writes in Ephesians 6:16, "in all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish the flaming darts of the evil one;" and in Romans 5:1-2,

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God

through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God." Faith keeps our priorities in line with God's priorities of saving the lost and giving us peace. "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." (Heb 11:1) Faith trusts that God will provide for all of our needs, including the words we need to speak in sharing our faith with others. Faith is more than a noun, more than head knowledge that Jesus is Lord. Faith is a way of life that spills into every aspect of our lives. To God alone be all glory & honor, worship & praise.



Summary: 2023 YTD, our income exceeds our expenses.

Good news: Compared to 2022 YTD, income is up 16% and expenses are up 2.1%. **Bad news**: Cash reserves are very low. Our weekly budget is \$8K. On April 30, 2023, cash

reserves in the general fund were \$25k. The target is to have cash reserves equal to 2-3 months of expenses. This low amount creates a high risk.

Postricted funds: We have \$75K in restricted funds and \$28

Restricted funds: We have \$75K in restricted funds and \$288K in the endowment fund. But these monies cannot be used to pay ordinary expenses like utilities, insurances, and wages.
