Re: VITALITY "PARTNERSHIP IN THE GOSPEL"

Read Philippians 1:3-11

The Letter to the Philippians is one of my most favorite letters, Spirit-inspired by St. Paul. It is written while Paul is under house arrest in Rome, awaiting the decision

of the Emperor concerning his fate.

As the verses above indicate, it is a letter of thanksgiving for the gift that was sent to him by the congregation in Philippi in support of his ministry in Rome. As one commentator observes, and I'm paraphrasing, the letter reveals his deep love and compassion for those in Philippi.'

Note his thankfulness is for their partnership in the Gospel. As demonstrated in the verses above, their partnership demonstrates unity in faith and purpose. Their partnership is not self-serving nor focused on Paul. Rather it is about getting the Gospel message out.

Such partnership is Christ-centered and unselfish. They had grown in faith to set aside personal for the sake of others. This is evidence of the fruits of faith.

Nearly every night, as I prepare to go to sleep, I pray for the following:

- 1. That God would grant to Pastor Fitch and me not only knowledge and wisdom but discernment as we together are charged to shepherd His flock at Peace.
- 2. That the congregation would benefit from God's directing through His under-shepherds, their pastors.
- 3. That together, pastors and sheep will be empowered by the Means of Grace God's Word and Sacraments to Reach Out, Serve Jesus, and Celebrate His Love.

Ministry today is as difficult as it has always been to conduct. As St. Paul was thankful for his partners in ministry, so am I.

As we move forward with the Re: Vitality process, it is my hope that the Task Force and pastors will be able to put forth a reasonable and attainable - by God's blessing – strategic plan for 2024-2026. It is my fervent prayer that pastors and congregation will walk in full partnership for the sake of the Gospel.

Re:VITALITY TASK FORCE: AN UPDATE

In their June meeting, the Task Force finished the Bible study, especially written for the Task Force's work. It established the biblical support for strategic planning in the congregation. There were 9 sections to the Bible study.

The Task Force received some "education" concerning emotional systems and how they affect the working of the congregation. They also had the opportunity to see the 10-year demographics of the congregation. The adopted (2012) Values Statement was distributed as well. This is to allow for support material to develop a Strategic Plan for 2024-2026. Finally, there was the preparation for the interview process in July.

In August (this month), the Task Force will be assembling on two Saturdays for a workshop to be guided in the process of a strategic plan. This process is facilitated by Pastor Schroeder using 9 sessions that are provided electronically by the Synod.

~On Marriage~

"It is not good for man to be alone" God spoke these words (Gen. 2:18) in a world that was not yet under the curse of sin after Adam & Eve's fall, and it sounds like a contradiction. After declaring all things "very good" (Gen. 1:31), God spoke the words "not good" about man being alone & isolated. Mankind was created for relationships with his Creator

and with the rest of creation. Man was also created for woman, and woman for man. God created their bodies different, yet complimentary, in order that they would become <u>one</u>. Marriage is not an afterthought. It is the pinnacle of God's creation because this great mystery was intended from the start to be an image of the one true marriage: the marriage of Christ and His Church (Eph. 5:32). Man was created for communion with God, and marriage was instituted in the image of that union.

In Scripture, the last words spoken of the world before the Fall were, "The man and his wife were both naked and were not ashamed" (Gen. 2:25). The very next word in the Hebrew is serpent, indicating that the marriage of man & wife is the target of Satan's fury, and his attack on Holy Marriage continues still. Satan is evil, not ignorant. He understands that marriage is the place where the Image of God is powerfully made known in creation. In the most intimate communion between two people, in the union of mind, body, spirit, will & possessions, there the union of Christ and His Church is mysteriously reflected.

A military general may not realize the importance of a strategic position until a superior general on the enemy side makes that position the focus of his attack. This is us. Sin-darkened reason cannot see or understand the glory God gives to holy marriage and also holy singleness. Only God's Word can enlighten us. Satan's non-stop and increasing attacks on both of these demands that the Church defend and protect chastity.

Like a tactician of sound mind, we do well not to squander enemy intelligence. False teachers continue to insist that attacks on marriage are mere debates or disagreements on morality. In the face of Satan's attacks, and contrary to the clear teaching of Holy Scripture, they would have us believe that our time, efforts & resources are better deployed elsewhere. Guided by the Gospel, we confess marriage as the earthly expression of Christ's relationship to His Holy Bride, the Church. Understanding the core connection of marriage to the Gospel, we also see much more clearly the threats to its foundations.

"Therefore a man shall <u>leave</u> his father and his mother and <u>cleave</u> to his wife, and they shall become <u>one flesh</u>" (Gen. 2:24). According to this divine institution, marriage is exclusive ("leave"), permanent ("cleave"), and a complementary ("one flesh") union. The committed love of marriage always reveals God's intention that individuals are called into community since marriage takes us beyond our individual identities so that we give ourselves to another who is distinctively different from us. St. Paul notes in Eph. 5 that husbands are called to sacrificial love toward their wives and wives to a willing respect for their husbands.

In responding to the bitter reality of divorce, the Word made flesh, our Lord Jesus, reaffirms the gift of marriage and then reminds us of an obvious implication: "Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate" (see Matt 19:3b-6). His warning is necessary because the beautiful gift of marriage, like all of God's created goodness, is marred by sin, which Jesus describes as "hardness of heart" (Matt 19:8). But sin does not have ultimate power.

Christians recognize that marriage is lived <u>under the cross</u>. Husbands & wives are not exempt from the suffering that comes with faithfulness in marriage, and our spouse is the one we will sin against most in this world. Yet this provides a wonderful training ground for us as God's people if we are willing to let Him shape us & our marriage relationship.

Trusting in the promises of Christ and clinging to each other in love, marriage is the arena for husband & wife to live together in repentance, forgiveness, and faith.

God's intention for marriage is skewed when it is treated as unimportant for human well-being, belittled as the godly gift it is, or twisted into forms that no longer resemble the gift God has intended. God gives marriage to humanity, to us, for our well-being. He commends biblical marriage for couples to make a deep commitment to one another before God, for a lifetime of giving to one another and forgiving each other.

The daily challenge in marriage is to reject your natural selfishness and live out your forgiven life in Jesus. It will be a lifetime of modeling forgiveness, forgiving each other as Jesus forgives you, a lifetime of love & respect, a lifetime of striving to love like Jesus because He first loved you.

Let us pray: Faithful Lord, pour Your grace upon husbands & wives, help them fulfill the vows they have made, reflecting Your steadfast love in lifelong faithfulness to each other. As members with them of the body of Christ, use us to support their life together in Christ our Lord. Amen.

- 4. Bake 20 minutes. Cool and enjoy!
