As We Gather

"Holy Cross Day" is one of the oldest and most widely spread observances of the Church. On it, we thank and praise Jesus Holy Name for the life and salvation He obtained for us by His Sacrifice upon the Cross. As Lutherans, we're not especially concerned with traditions concerning the Cross itself, since we are blessed to receive the very fruits and benefits of the Holy Cross in the preaching and ministry of the Gospel, in the waters of Holy Baptism, and in the Body and Blood of Christ Jesus. We are, of course, always concerned with the preaching and confession of the Cross of Christ the Crucified, proclaiming His death until He comes in glory for the final judgment (1 Cor. 1:18—2:2; 11:26). Holy Cross Day is an opportunity to revel in the glory and victory of the Cross, in spite of how it looks and feels to the world (and to our own fallen flesh!). We are able to exult in the triumph of the Cross as the self-sacrifice of the Son of God for our salvation. For by His death He conquered death, atoned for sin, and trampled Satan's vile head beneath His feet; and as He was lifted up in death upon the Cross once-for-all, so does He call people from all nations to Himself by the preaching of His Cross, to die and rise with Him by faith in His Gospel of forgiveness.

Today we celebrate the Lord's Supper, Holy Communion

Scripture teaches that Holy Communion is a sacred act, established by Christ Himself and is given to His Church. As members of **The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod**, we hold the doctrine of the Real Presence, in with and under; meaning that Jesus gives His Body and Blood

with the bread and wine, as He Himself says, "This is my body... This is my blood... for the forgiveness of sins." (Matthew 26:26ff)

The Holy Scriptures also teach us to receive this meal in a way that is responsible and healthy. As overseer, St. Paul wrote- "let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself" (1 Cor. 11:28-29). Out of genuine care for God's people we ask that those (1) who have not been baptized and instructed in the faith or (2) who come from another church body, not in altar or pulpit fellowship with us, refrain from receiving Holy Communion.

For those preparing to receive Holy Communion, Luther encourages us to ask ourselves these questions:

Do I repent of my sins, desiring to turn away from them, back to the Lord?

Do **I believe** Jesus died and rose for me and gives me His Body and Blood this day "for the forgiveness of sins"?

Do I intend to use this means of grace to change my life, following His will and way? We ask that all who receive the Lord's Supper fill out a "Care Card" and place it in the offering plate. <u>Please note that reduced-alcoholic white wine is available in the center cups of the communion tray.</u>
