What Are You Doing With What You've Been Given?

Jesus tells a powerful story in Matthew 25:14–30. A master goes on a journey and entrusts his servants with his property—five talents to one, two to another, and one to a third. When the master returns, he finds that two of the servants have put those talents to work. They've doubled what they were given. The third buried his talent. He returned it, untouched and unused.

That parable still speaks to us today.

You've been given something. Whether it's a skill, a voice, time, experience, a way with people, a heart for organization, or hands that serve—you have something. Some of you have a lot. Some may think you have very little. But the question isn't how much. The question is: What are you doing with what you've been given?

A Challenge to Multiply

In the business world, leaders talk about "multipliers." These are people who share what they know and raise up others around them. They don't keep their skills to themselves. They build capacity. They strengthen teams. They make others better.

That's what we need in our church family. We need people who are ready to multiply. We need people who will serve. People who will mentor. People who will invite others in. People who will help shape the future of Peace Lutheran.

As September Approaches...

This fall, we'll begin looking for members to serve on our church boards. Our Constitution lays out those boards—Elders, Trustees, Evangelism, Stewardship, Education, and more. Each of these boards carries real responsibilities. They serve the church in different but connected ways.

We are now looking for:

You may not feel qualified. You may never have served before. But don't count yourself out.

 The Board of Education needs you.
- Do you quietly help behind the scenes? The Trustees will put you to work.
- Do you care deeply about our spiritual life together? Elders and Worship support that mission.

There is something for everyone.

What's Holding You Back?

I want to ask you directly: What is keeping you from serving?

Is it time? Confidence? Feeling like your skills aren't useful in a church setting? Let me know.

We can work through that. We can talk about what's realistic. We can help you find a good fit. What matters is a willing heart.

Just like the parable, we are not all given the same talents. But we are all called to use what we've been given.

The Church is Looking

As we continue our search for a new pastor, we are also looking for something else. We are looking for people who want to make the church whole again. Not just through preaching or teaching, but through service, teamwork, and faithful presence. We need your help to steward what God has given us.

We are not just keeping the doors open. We are building something. A future for our children. A place for the hurting. A community rooted in the Word of God.

Will you pray about where your talents belong? Will you step up—or help someone else step up? Let's not bury what we've been given. Let's multiply it.


BIBLE STUDY GROUPS

Following a Communion service, what are the prescribed means for the disposal of the consecrated wine and wafers?

Answer ... according to www.lcms.org:

"To begin, care should be taken that inordinate amounts of bread and wine are not consecrated at each service, but rather just what is needed for that service.

While Scripture does not tell us whether Christ's body and blood are still present in the bread and wine after Communion, we should still treat what remains with greatest reverence.

The point here is to recognize the fact that these elements were used in the service to deliver our Lord's very body and blood

to us. How we treat them after the service should never lose sight of that great mystery of faith.

There are two places to find helpful information on this topic. One is Section B.2.c. of the Commission on Theology and Church Relations' 1983 document titled, <u>Theology and Practice of the Lord's Supper</u>.

B.2.c. Post Communion Reverence

The consecrated elements which remain after all have communed should be treated with reverence. This reverence has been expressed by Lutherans in various ways. Some have followed the ancient practice of burning the bread and pouring the wine upon the earth. Others have established a basin and drain-piscina-specifically for disposal for the wine. The elders or altar guild may also return the consecrated bread and wine to specific containers for future sacramental use, or the elders and pastor can consume the remaining elements. All of these practices should be understood properly. The church is not, thereby, conferring upon the elements some abiding status apart from their use in the Lord's Supper itself."
