Reports

1. Secretary Report

Allison Stone

-Julie Hendricks moved to approve the March meeting minutes. Grant Forsyth seconded and the motion carried.

2. Treasurer's Report

- -Liz Shannon presented the Treasurer's report. We ended April \$14,931.44 in the red. Also, \$26,823.99 in the red for the year to date. Our current mortgage balance is \$350,216.25. Julie Hendricks moved to approve the Treasurer's report. Michele Lox seconded and the motion carried.

- -Michele Lox presented the Community report.
- -Ruby's Pantry sold out of shares for the month of May.

4. Discipleship

- -Taylor Wheeler presented the Discipleship report.
- -We currently have 156 kids signed up for VBS. 48 being preschoolers. There is currently a waiting list for preschool sign up with 48 being the cap.
- -The last youth group meeting at Pastor Weight's house was a success. The youth group decided to continue to meet during the summer. They are also planning a trip this summer to Rock Ridge in Ely.

5. Elders

Perry Collins (not present)

- -Pastor Ludwig presented the Elders report.
- -There will be a meeting May 21st at 6pm regarding the possibility of starting a school at PIC.
- -The last meeting for the Guardian Angels will be May 24th.
- -The ushers are going to revamp their scheduling process and have some training and possible added duties, such as handling of the offering to the safe after services.
- -There are 10 new members joining PIC.
- -notes from Larry Erickson:

Organ: Our organ technician has visited a third and final time. On the second visit, he installed a new power supply and found a few more suspect connections. He also found the need to replace a large ribbon cable, which he ordered. As it turns out the exact cable was not available. So, the tech had to modify a cable on site. While the organ has always been functional to a large degree, I would say we went from 90% to possibly 97% after the three visits. At a meeting with Beth, Laura, and both Pastors it was decided we have taken this effort far enough. Both Beth and Laura agreed that there is enough function now to continue to use "as is". It was also agreed that we will research a replacement organ. Laura and Beth will continue compiling information about new and used organs over the summer. Life expectancy for an electric organ is around 20 years.

AV Operator: We will need to hire one more AV person to replace Sophia. We are good with coverage for the summer, with only one service, so this can wait until fall. Pastor Ludwig suggested we start looking right away.

AV area: Work continues on cleanup of the AV room. Although it might not look like much has changed, a lot of rewiring has happened behind the scenes. Currently the job is approximately 20% done. The goal is to continue to keep the area functional and at the same time reduce the clutter and unnecessary cabling that accumulated over the years.

- -The upright commercial vacuum is back from repairs.

- -The vinyl siding has been fixed from loosening from wind/storms.

- -Heat tape will be placed in downspouts to prevent ice build up in the preschool area.
- -Ring cameras will be able to be installed now that it is warmer.
