Treasurer's Report

- -Liz Shannon presents the Treasurer's report.
- -December ended in the red at \$37,608.37. Our current mortgage is \$317,479.43. Julie Hendricks moved to approve the budget. Michele Lox seconded and the motion carried.
 - New state law that applies to PIC.

- There is a new employment law in effect as of January 1st, 2024. It states that employers must allow employees to earn one hour of paid earned safe and sick time for every 30 hours worked, up to a maximum of 48 hours per year.
- Liz will check with payroll to make sure they have the software to accommodate the new law for PIC employees and report back at the February meeting.

- -Michele Lox presents the Community report.
- -January's Ruby's Pantry sold 182 shares.
- -There was a shortage of volunteers and boy scouts.

- -PIC had 40 new members join in 2023. Also, there was an average of 287 worshippers per sunday in 2023. Over 700 people attended the Christmas Eve services, with 446 at the 4 pm service.
- -The organ continues to get worse. It is possible that it may not be able to be used at all sooner than later. The organ committee is still researching options for replacement. Considering all options-new organ verses used pipe organ. The committee is looking into the possibility of St. Lawrence Church Catholic Church selling their old organ because of an upgrade for them.
- -There is a guardian angel training session on January 30th.
 - Residents will begin living in The Pillars in February
 - Church Secretary vacancy
 - -Hilari and Loren are relocating to Washington state. The open secretary position will be posted soon.
