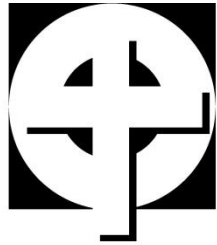

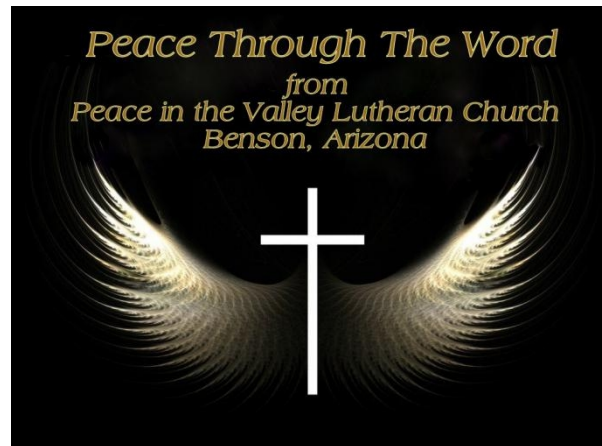

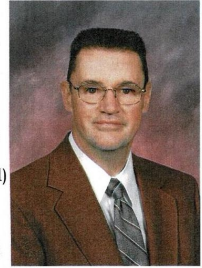

On retirement Chuck and Karen moved to S.E. Arizona where they enjoyed the dry, warmer climate and beauty of the high desert.

Chuck was a humble and faithful servant of Jesus. He joyfully taught the Bible to children and adults for over 40 years at our churches, in member's homes, and for BSF for which he was a member. He held every church council office except treasurer. He was an elder for many years, also head elder plus served on many committees, was usher and greeter. He was a willing and very able worker always giving glory to God.

Chuck will be laid to rest at Fort Snelling National Cemetery, Minneapolis.

Chuck enjoyed time with family and friends, reading, handyman projects, and travel. He and Karen were blessed to have taken 4 cruises, the last one was his choice, a cruise to Alaska with Julia and David.

After almost one year we finally had the beautiful service for my husband, Chuck.

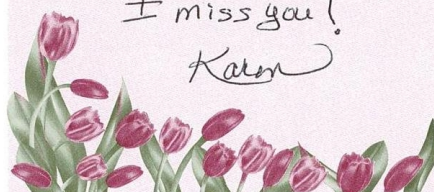

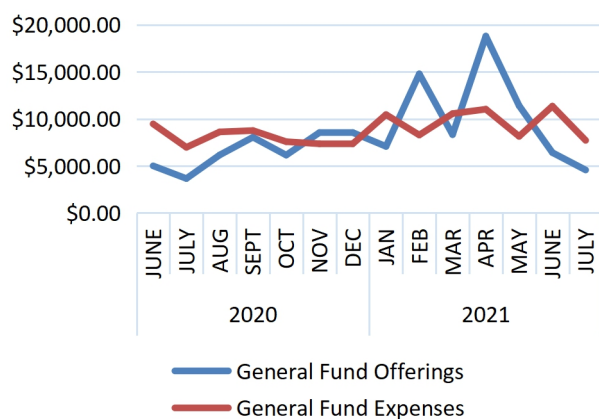

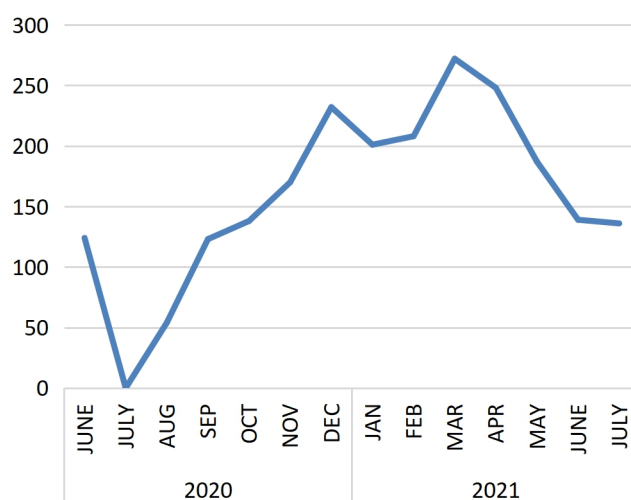
