


PITV HAPPENINGS NEWSLETTER November 2021



Pastor's Corner

As we come to the month of November perhaps our thoughts go to St. Valentines Day, Thanksgiving, and a nod towards the church year of Advent that is on the horizon.

This month of November the subject of love is in the air. Love is a gigantic subject not only in the world but in Holy Scripture as well. The very first commandment of God is for humanity to love the Lord with all one's mind and soul and the second is like the first, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

This month being Valentine's Day on November 14, Saint Valentine very much demonstrated loving ones neighbor as oneself. Saint Valentine was a third century Roman Catholic Priest who ministered to persecuted Christians. Under the rule of Roman Emperor Claudius he had to maintain a strong army, however he was having a difficult time getting soldiers in which to join the military leagues. He believed that Roman men were unwilling to join the army because of their strong attachment to their wives and families.

In order to rid of the problem, Claudius banned all marriages and engagements in Rome. Valentine, realizing this injustice, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages in secret. Once his actions were discovered Claudius ordered that Valentine be put to death. He was subsequently arrested and dragged to the prefect of Rome who condemned him to be beaten to death with clubs and for his head to be cut off. It is believed that while St. Valentine was in jail, he left a farewell note for the jailers daughter who had become his friend for which he signed it from your Valentine. St. Valentine was executed on Feb 14, 270.

So as we come to November may all of us gladly receive the love that our gracious Lord gives to us in abundance through Word and Sacrament Ministry and may we be like St. Valentine to share that love with others that our Lord uniquely puts in our various respective paths of influence. To each and everyone of you, please have a most blessed and loving November.
