*I acknowledged my sin to you, and I did not cover my iniquity;
I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord," and you forgave the iniquity of my sin.*

Psalm 32:5

Have you heard (or asked) these questions? "I thought Jesus rose again, we should be happy, not downcast?" "Why should I confess, Jesus already forgave me." "What is Lent?" "Why take so long to be depressed – let's just focus on the celebration?" "We shouldn't talk about sin, I thought the Bible says, 'God is Love', sin talk just makes me feel bad." And the ever-popular, "Lent? What does church have to do with laundry?"

February 26th is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the 40-day season of Lent. As the Israelites were in the wilderness 40 years before God brought them to the Promised Land and Jesus was tempted in the wilderness 40 days before beginning His earthly ministry, we have 40 days of preparation before the celebration of the Resurrection. Just as most training and preparation is necessary but not always pleasant, Lent is not always a happy time. But through the preparation of Lent, the celebration of Easter has its full meaning.

We begin Lent in ashes. We are reminded "dust you are and to dust you shall return." We are reminded of our place as the creation in front of the Almighty Creator. And we know we have not kept our place. We ignore our Creator and His commands. We rebel and pretend that we are in charge. Until we find ourselves in trouble and cry out how unfair God is. We know we are sinners who cannot save ourselves. We need a savior. As we continue through the journey of Lent, it is the journey to the cross. We know God's sacrifice – that the Father sent His only Son to die for us. The cross is in full view all 40 days.

In God's mercy, He took the punishment for us rebellious creatures. But we know the full story. We know beyond the cross is the empty tomb. In the 40 days of Lent, we do not count the Sundays (take out your calendar and check!) The Sundays through Lent are miniEasters. We celebrate, even in the midst of our sorrow and repentance, that God in His grace not only takes our punishment but gives us the gift of Resurrection.

So why have Lent? What is the gift of mercy without knowing we deserve the punishment not given? What is the gift of grace without knowing we do not deserve the gift of Jesus' righteousness? Lent is the time of the Holy Spirit to work in us that the gift of Jesus' death and resurrection is **for you**.

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:8-9)

What a blessing the gift of confession is. We have a God who always listens, always forgives, and is always present. As we take this journey of Lent, together we celebrate God's gifts of mercy and grace. And together we look forward to the cross and the Resurrection.

God bless our journey together.

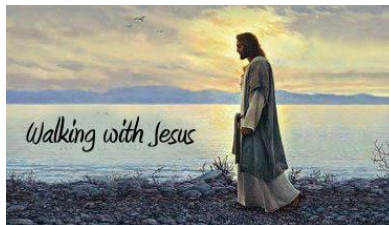

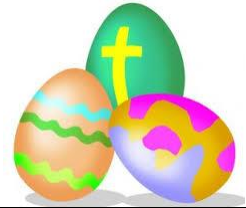


Knit and Pray:

Call Day Results:

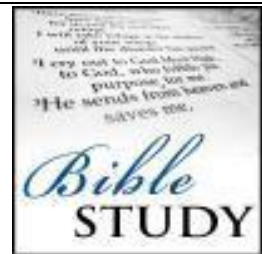

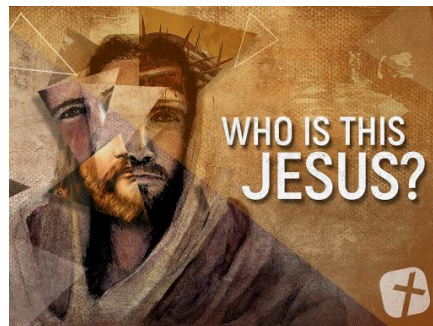

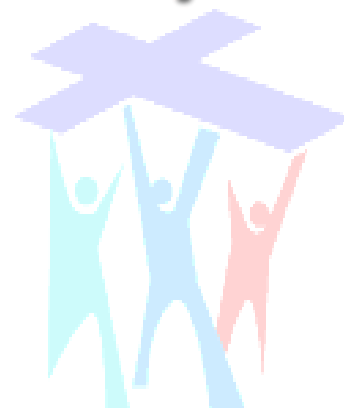
