Isaiah 9:6-7

"Be Prepared!" is the well-known Boy Scout motto. (Full disclosure: I was never a Boy Scout, but my mom was a Den Mother when my brother was a Cub Scout.) Whether or not you have ever had connection with the Scouts, "Be Prepared" is a good way to be. As we approach December each year, it seems that everyone is preparing. We string up lights, make lists, and shop. We prepare to decorate, which, in itself, is preparation to celebrate. Usually, we are either preparing our homes to receive guests or preparing ourselves to travel.

This year, we ask, "How do we prepare?" We have our preparation traditions (1st Wednesday in Advent – eat chili and decorate the church... but what about this year?) Preparation has more unknowns this year. How can we have our traditional parties and concerts? Even if we do, should we prepare for less people (because people are being safe) or more (because something is happening)? What will the celebration of Christmas look like? How can we possibly be prepared?

In our wonderings of how to prepare for this unusual year, we are in good company. As Zechariah was performing his traditional priestly duties, God's messenger Gabriel brought him news to prepare for a baby in the house. Zechariah asked how this could possibly happen as he and his wife were old. (Luke 1:5-25) As Mary was preparing for the wonderful role of traditional wife, Gabriel told her to prepare to be mother to the Son of God. She wondered how this could be as she was not yet married. (Luke 1:26-38) After months of silent reflection, Zechariah praised God for his son's role as prophet of the Most High. Mary answered simply, "*let it be to me according to your word.*"

Our traditions will look different this year. Most of the parties, concerts, and events we look forward to will be virtual or missing. Many of our family gatherings will be smaller, by zoom, or a simple telephone call saying "see you next year." But God's preparations are the same. We may or may not clean our homes to prepare for guests, but God's cleansing in baptism remains. We may or may not prepare large meals, but God continues to feed us in His Supper. Our celebrations may look different, but the focus remains. God the Father, in His mercy has sent His Son to be born, die, and rise again for you. The message of the angels given to the shepherds remains for you: *Unto you is born this day in the City of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.* And nothing can change this good news.



Throughout the past months, we have been in prayer and discussion about the Lord's vision for Prince of Peace. Our God continues to be at work in 2020! The Overall Vision Plan has been given to Elders and Mission and Ministry Council. As our Leadership refines the vision and takes the first steps, continue to keep them and the process in your prayers. Your input and conversation over the past many months have been invaluable! The mini food pantry at the southwest corner of the parking lot has been open for the past 4 weeks. It has been stocked 2-3 times a week, so it is definitely getting used! Once, while stocking it (the last week of October), an older lady stopped to get a few items. This was her second visit and she related how grateful she was for the pantry. "I am on a limited income and can't drive very far, so this helps me out."

The most popular food items in the pantry seem to be cereal, canned tuna, canned chicken, Spaghettios, peanut butter, jelly, baby food, fruit cups and juice boxes. Toiletry items are always in demand! Popular items are diapers, toilet paper, shampoo, deodorant, laundry soap, dish soap, toothpaste and body soap. Thank you, POP family, for your contributions!

Catechism – Same God, Same Faith, New Process




