*(God's Word tells us to give honor where it is due: Many of the following thoughts come from Dr. Dale Meyer's message given at the ordination of Rev. Mark Renner.)*

"This is a bad time to be the Church." Have you heard this statement? Have you said or thought this sentiment? It is most certainly a challenging time to be the traditional church. Many of the ways we have inherited of thinking and acting are being challenged in the world today. Many activities over the last year have needed modification from years before. Our potlucks and gatherings, events and service projects were modified, sparsely attended, or completely absent. We have longed for our routine connections – sharing the common cup, handshakes, and hugs at the sharing of the peace. We have wondered if we will ever again gather as we used to for the Lord's Service let alone all the ways we are comfortable with for sharing the Gospel with the community. And truth be told, we were wondering how well those ways were working in our community even before anyone heard of a pandemic.

We know we have been blessed at Prince of Peace. We are able to gather for worship – now with the added ability to gather online for those who need it. We are able to engage in some of our activities and events – both in fellowship with one another and in mission for the community. In a time when many of our brothers and sisters around the country have yet to be allowed to gather again, we see "the light at the end of the tunnel" looking forward to removing restrictions of seating and interaction (not yet... but coming, we pray).

However, there is a danger coming. As we long to "get back" the ability to share more and "return" to our traditions, we must be on guard not to long for a return to comfort. The church in America has clung to our comfort for years. And we have often ignored the fact that the culture – which for generations encouraged and upheld values that mirrored Christianity – has left. This divorce is no more apparent than during this pandemic when certain hospitals in our area still will not allow clergy to visit patients. The culture has lost the understanding that spiritual care is at least as important to a person as mental and physical care. And even where mental and spiritual care is understood as important, there is no understanding of where the foundation of spiritual care resides – not within yourself, but from outside and above – from our Creator.

It is a challenging time to be the Church. We live today among people whose foundations are shaken. People who rely for peace on income have been given indefinite layoff. People who rely on entertainment have missed their daily fix of sports and new movies. People who rely for peace on their own health now take precautions to step outside. But God's Church – we that have always known Jesus as the source of all peace – are not shaken. And we have hope that goes beyond masks, vaccines, and anything else of this world.

It is a good time to be God's Church because our friends and neighbors are prepared to hear a message of hope that is certain – not just "someday..."; not just "only if..." but sure and certain hope for today. Jesus Christ has overcome death and the grave. We are united in His death and resurrection – given the victory and the promise. *"Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?"* Romans 8:35. Just as the Church has always lived counter to the culture and been persecuted for it, the Church has been the ark for God's truth and the voice of God's hope. *"That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties."* In a world where foundations are shaken – hope is needed. Our friends and neighbors are asking so many questions, and the Lord of the Church has given you the answer – Jesus Christ. We pray today for the Holy Spirit to open our eyes to the increasing opportunities to share the Good News.





## Discipleship at Home and in Community
