[Elijah] went a day's journey into the wilderness and came and sat down under a broom tree. And he asked that he might die, saying, "It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my fathers." And he lay down and slept under a broom tree. And behold, an angel touched him and said to him, "Arise and eat." And he looked, and behold, there was at his head a cake baked on hot stones and a jar of water. And he ate and drank and lay down again. And the angel of the Lord came again a second time and touched him and said, "Arise and eat, for the journey is too great for you." And he arose and ate and drank, and went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb, the mount of God. -1 Kings 19:4-8

It is springtime – the weather is getting warmer and we are able to do more outside activities. In many households, it is time to plan summer vacations - journeys to see relatives, old friends, and new sights. Vacations are, by definition, a time of rest and relaxation. Vacation journeys are part of the fun. But some journeys are not vacations. These journeys are treks into the unknown.

In the scriptures, we see many such journeys. God calls Abraham to journey to a new land. The people of Israel have a journey of 40 years as they are led through the wilderness on their way to the Promised Land. Elijah, and many of the prophets, journey all throughout the land. Jesus journeyed into the wilderness to be tempted for 40 days. The disciples followed Jesus on journeys for three years. Paul and others made missionary journeys.

Our lives are full of journeys. Some are physical but many more are journeys of life and faith. There were moments of great joy but also moments of great weariness. In 1 Kings chapter 18, we read of God's great victory over the prophets of Baal on Mt. Carmel. Afterward, Elijah runs 15 miles to Jezreel. But there, his life is in danger from King Ahab and Jezebel so he travels another 90 miles south to Beersheba. He is so weary, physically and emotionally, he asks for death.

Eighteen months ago, none of us had heard of Covid. But just over a year ago, we suspended all services and activities. We praise the Lord that we have been meeting again for many months even with certain modifications. We are thankful that we can continue to modify our safety precautions to more fully engage in God's gift of being family together. But the journey is long and many of the changes are not happening as quickly as we would like. We are weary from the journey. Often the most wearying part of a journey is not knowing when it will end.

The real question, though, is not when the journey will end, but how are you being sustained on the way. How is the Lord sustaining you during these times. Jesus does not promise us that our journeys of faith will be easy. The scriptures recount both the great highs that God gave to his people and the valleys through which God walked with His people. The constant is God and His provision.

Take a moment to ask yourself if you are availing yourself of the means that the Lord uses to strengthen us for the journey. Are you being fed with God's Word in Bible study and worship, whether joining online or in person. Are you being fed with the physical and spiritual food of the Lord's Supper in worship or by contacting Pastor to receive individually? Are you being strengthened or are you starving yourself amid this journey?

The Lord is the one who sustains the weary, the fatigued, and the tired. "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." Matthew 11:28 "For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in them." John 6:55-56 Be strengthened and nourished for the journey with your family!

In loving Christian care for our brothers and sisters, some modifications will be made this year to our traditional schedule.

Maundy Thursday (April 1st):

We will have service at 7:00 p.m.

Communion and Stripping of the Altar

Good Friday (April 2nd):

We will hold two (identical) services: 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m.

Easter Vigil (April 3rd):

We will have service at 5:30 p.m.

Easter morning (April 4th):

We will hold three services at 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m., and 11:00 a.m.

Services will also be online, live on our Facebook page.

Signups for Good Friday and Easter will be available through the website home page. As with Christmas, signups are not required, but encouraged in order to ensure room for guests.

We continue to pray fervently to the Lord for a quick end to the pandemic -- and the fear and hardship it is causing. **If your family is experiencing hardship** at this time, **we can help** through programs here at Prince of Peace and contacts with many other avenues of help. **If you have not experienced hardship**, consider a special **Thank Offering to the Lord** for His continued blessings.

All Covid protocols we have implemented over the past year have been for one reason only – not because of any infinitely debatable science, but to help remove barriers for any of our brothers and sisters to be able to receive the Lord's gifts. As we continue to modify and remove some of these protocols, please show God's love and forgiveness to those who, for many reasons, are in a different level of comfort than you.

As we continue in the journey of "opening up" – as with all aspects of life right now – you may notice some changes in the coming months and weeks. Once again, the common cup will be available for those choosing that option for communion. Seating restrictions will be removed on one side of the sanctuary. Those not concerned about remaining distanced should sit on the side without tape (so there is space for our brothers and sisters who need to remain seated distantly for now.)

We praise God together for His gift of technology and invention! We have installed "air scrubbers" which purify the air and filter out surface and airborne contaminants. We have received \$1640.00 in specified thank offerings toward this project. Praise God!!



FOOD PANTRY update: The mini food pantry has been heavily used since the beginning of the year. Our supplies are low and we are in need of almost everything. Some of the most used items are cereal, crackers, boxed potatoes, noodle sides, pancake mix and syrup, fruit, veggies, baked beans, kidney beans, spaghetti, laundry soap, dish soap, toothpaste, shampoo and deodorant. 




