

"The three most important things when buying a house: location, location, location." No matter how nice the house is, if it is too far from work or school, you will always be in the car; if it is on a busy street or under a flight pattern, you will never be free of the noise; if it is in an area subject to flooding, blizzards, or earthquakes, you had better know how to handle it. Only slightly less important than location, is "good bones" – solid structure on a firm foundation. No matter where the house is located, if it is not sturdy you will end up in a pile of rubble. A solid house in a good location then needs good systems – electrical, plumbing, and heating. These are the "lifeblood" of the house. Without them, daily living is a chore (literally).

What are the "systems", "structure/foundation", and "location" of your house – not where you physically live, but your spiritual house? What systems bring faith to and from your life? What keeps your faith strong and what is your faith built upon? How does your location affect your spiritual house?

Salvation is the gift of God for all people given by the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Faith is the gift of God which clings to salvation – which enables us to say "yes, this gift is for me!" For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, Ephesians 2:8. Our spiritual "systems" are those habits that feed our faith and keep us spiritually healthy - daily devotions, gathering with fellow Christians for Bible study, prayer, gathering with God's people in worship – the ways God gives for us to listen to His voice and grow in relationship with Him. To keep our systems flowing smoothly, we must inspect them and engage in upkeep regularly. It is easy to get out of the habit and then find ourselves in trouble without water and light.

Of course, systems can only be as good as the structure and foundation for which they are providing. The foundation of faith is Jesus Christ, the Living Word of God. Systems, habits, parts of life that are built on anything less will crumble like a house built on sand. Not that God's people cannot engage in anything that does not overtly have a Bible verse stamped on it. Christians work for Christian and non-Christian companies. Christians can have non-Christian friends (otherwise, how would others hear the Gospel?) But Christians know that all of life – relationships, work, hobbies, etc. – are all a gift from God and all are lived out under His direction. Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters. Colossians 3:23. All of life is built on the foundation that Christ has redeemed you and the Holy Spirit guides you.

"Location, location, location". Jesus promises His presence as we live life under His guidance. For where two or three are gathered in My name, there I am with them." Matthew 18:20 And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age. Matthew 28:20 But the presence of God is more easily known where we receive His gifts through His promised means of grace. When we are gathered with His family, we can receive His gifts without the noise of the world. Instead, we are built up together as the family of God. And together, built on the foundation of Jesus, we can stand against the world's storms. You also, like living stones, are being built into a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood, offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. I Peter 2:5 In him the whole building is joined together and rises to become a holy temple in the Lord. And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by his Spirit. Ephesians 2:21-22


"Foundations of Faith"
