

If you ask people to describe God, you will get many different answers. Some may answer "God is powerful" or "God is distant" or "God loves everyone" or "God is only imaginary". Just as important (and more foundational) to <a href="https://www.mbc.uhea.com/what">what</a> people think about God is <a href="https://www.mbc.uhea.com/what.how who God is?">why.</a> How do you know who God is? People often form their ideas of God (without knowing it) based on their own experiences filtered through human reason or what they have been told is solid science.

It is important to stop and ask ourselves, "Why do I believe what I believe?" "How do I know who God is?" When we actually stop to ask the question (and honestly seek the answer) we recognize that what we know of God is not based on ourselves. We have no need to "figure it out" or "make it up". God has revealed Himself to us. God has shown us all we need to know about Himself – through His creation, His actions, and especially through our Savior Jesus.

In creation, we see the power and wonder (and variety) of God. People are constantly trying to withstand or harness the power of water, wind, and creatures. All these things God spoke into existence. The beauty of the flowers and the variety of climates show the creativity of our Creator. The immensity and perfection of God is seen in the vastness of the universe (many aspects we have not even begun to know) and the intricacy of the atom – and the balance in which all creation hangs together.

In God's actions, we also see His power but we see the personal nature of God. As Jesus changed water into wine at a wedding in Cana, God cares for every detail of your life. We cannot see all things as God does, but when we begin to see life from God's perspective, our daily work becomes a gift – at home, in our occupations, in our community. God is at work in subtle and powerful ways.

Most specifically, God has revealed His very nature in Christ Jesus. ...at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, Hebrews 1:1-2 God put on flesh and lived among His creation for one reason: to live perfectly under his law and die to earn forgiveness for you, me, and all creation. In this, God reveals His very heart. Jesus said, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father." John 14:9 Through His Word, God repeats The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. Psalm 103:8

God does not reveal everything to us. We cannot fully comprehend God. But God reveals what is important for us to know about who He is to us. Next month, we will continue with how we can be discerning in how we see God today – especially in the people around us. Look for God's work in your life today as together we are Sharing Jesus – Living His love through discipleship at home and in community.

As you read this, Summer is upon us! You deserve some relaxation and inspiration this Summer. **Why not stop into our Library** [right next door to Pastor John's office], and pick up a good book or two for some special reading time? Let me suggest just a few titles and authors.

The shelves on the far right as you face them are all novels. If you are looking for a particular author, like I was, these Novels are arranged by author, alphabetically. I was looking for a book **by Frank Peretti**, which I had read back in 1986. I found it and several more good ones by Frank.

FRANK PERETTI—His novels help Christians see the battles that are going on in the Spiritual Realm and how our prayers can help people who are struggling. "For we are not contending against flesh and blood, but against the principalities, against the powers, against the world rulers of this present darkness. Therefore take up the full armor of God... (Ephesians 6:12-13).

**THIS PRESENT DARKNESS** is a good book to start with as we become better equipped to pray in our world today. **THE PROPHET** a good book to give you insight into some of the forces that affect the T.V. News.

MARJORIE HOLMES—is a best-selling author and her books are loved by many. They bring Scripture to life. She has been a columnist for Women's Day Magazine and the Washington Star. Why not try:

**THE MESSIAH**. In this book and others, she recreates the stories of the Bible in full human dimension. If you have watched The Chosen series on TV, you will enjoy her stories about <u>Biblical people</u>.

KAREN KINGSBURY—who was called by TIME Magazine "the Queen of Christian Fiction," has written several Series of books that are on our shelves. One that I suggest:

**SUMMER: A SEASON OF HOPE**. It is one of a series called the Baxter Family Drama. You will be introduced to some wonderful Christian people.

**JAN KARON**— is one of Carolyn Weiss' favorite authors of Christian Fiction. Several of Karon's books sit on our shelves, awaiting your reading pleasure. A good place to start could be:

**AT HOME IN MITFORD.** It is a comedy where mysteries and miracles abound. Once you enter the world of Mitford, you won't want to leave.
