This session is not about proving the Scriptures to be the inspired word of God, but to answer the logical question: "Are the Gospels credible historical documents?"

Who wrote the Gospels? Why?

Matthew – disciple of Jesus

Mark – companion of Peter (and Paul)

Luke - companion of Paul

John – disciple of Jesus

If these are not the authors, then why not choose more prominent people (Peter, Mary, James) as some rejected writings did?

The Gospels are biographies, but not "modern biographies"

Ex: Not much of Jesus' early life

The Gospels have a theological agenda.

Does this undermine their historical credibility?

## Contradictions between the Gospels?

Most apparent contradictions are easily resolved

The Gospels give different perspectives

If all details matched exactly, we would suspect "collusion"

Caesar	100-44 B.C.	900 A.D.	1000	10

## "Earmarks of Credibility"

- Based on eye-witness testimony
- Written not long after the events
- Reliably transmitted
- Contain embarrassing accounts
- Confirmed by other evidence (documents and archaeology)
